

2012, has flown by and we recently marked the one year anniversary of the opening of the Performance Hall at the Old U.S. Mint, which opened its doors on November 12, 2011.

The Performance Hall, located on the third floor of the Old U.S. Mint, is the result of an innovative partnership between the National Park Service and the Louisiana State Museum to bring a world class music venue home to the birthplace of jazz.

The New Orleans Jazz NHP will sponsor educational jazz performances and other special events during the day and the Louisiana State Museum will hold events and performances primarily during evening hours.



In celebration of the National Park Service Centennial in 2016, the park entered into a partnership with the Louisiana State Museum to create a "world class jazz museum and performance center" at the historic Old U.S. Mint, 400 Esplanade Ave.
