Sixty-Eight Rich Men on the Steamer Portland.

STACKS OF YELLOW METAL!

Some Have \$5,000, Many Have More, and a Few Bring Out \$100,000 Each.

THE STEAMER CARRIES \$700,000.

Special Tug Chartered by the Post-Intelligencer to Get the News.

The Latest Reports From the New Eldorado Arrive This Morning—Interviews With Those Who Have Come Down From the North With New-Found Fortunes—The Recent Strikes Seem to Be as Rich as Reported—There is Plenty of Gold, But Only the Hardy and Provident Can Secure It—No Man Who Is Without a Suitable Outfit Should Temporarily Leave in That Remote Region—There Will No Doubt Be a Great Rush for the New Discoveries, and the Majority Will Outfit in and Leave From Seattle.

BEINGING RACK GOLD.

Marquette Miners on the Portland... On BOARD STEAMER PORTLAND, 3 o'clock, it is thought that more than a ton of gold will be sent with the steamer.

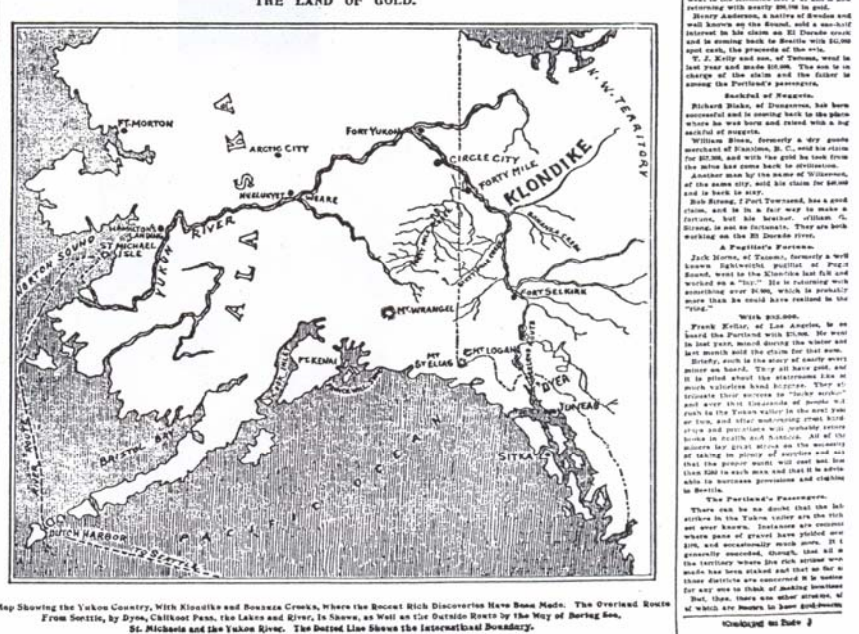
