SIGHTSEEING IN THE LAKE MEAD REGION

LAKE MEAD - Over 550 miles of shoreline developed in the Colorado River by Hoover Dam. Botanical garden at visitor center, sailing, boating, fishing, swimming, and water skiing. For additional information, call Visitor Center (702) 293-8906.

DEATH VALLEY - A one and 1/2-hour drive on US Hwy 95 north, then NV Hwy 374 south. Fantastic desert formations and geological display. Points of interest include Zabriski Point, Old Mines, and Scotty's Castle. For additional information, call Visitor Center (619) 786-2331 or Furnace Creek Inn and Ranch. Entrance fee.

FLOYD R. LAMB STATE
PARK -15 miles north on US
Hwy 95. This green oasis, a
natural for bird watchers, offers
pleasant picnicking facilities on
16 acres of land adjacent to a 7acre lake and horseback riding.
Open daily from 7 AM to
sunset. For additional

GRAND CANYON - Easily accessible via Scenic Airlines 739-1900, Nevada Airlines, and others for stopover or flyover 1-day trips. By car take US Hwy 93 south to King-man, I-40 east to Williams, Arizona, and Hwy 64 north to the entrance to the South Rim. For additional information, call Visitor Center (602) 638-7888 or Visitor Services (602) 638-7760. Entrance fee.

HOOVER DAM - 45 minutes from Las Vegas S. on Boulder Hwy to the source of power for Arizona, S. California, and S. Nevada. Tours 9:00 AM to 4:15 PM. See the 28-minute movie in Boulder City first at the Visitors Bureau located at Nevada Drug Store, 1228 Arizona Street, or the Goldstrike Inn on US Hwy 93 at Lake Mead. Group tours - Bureau of Reclamation (702) 293-8367.

HUALAPAI INDIAN
RESERVATION - Approx. 44
miles south on US 93 to Dolan
Springs turnoff, then about 32
miles to just before Lake Mead

City. Take graded unpaved road for about 5-1/2 miles, following signs to "Grand Canyon West" to Indian Reservation, keep going about 5-1/2 miles past cattle guard to small junction, then keep going straight for about 1 mile to Quarter-master Canyon. Raft trips available. Great photo views, how-ever, no facilities. Entrance permits may be obtained at the Meadview Market (issued for Dept. of Wildlife, 602/769-2227), N. of Lake Mead City in Meadview, AZ, for a minimal fee.

Visitors may also take air/ground tours that include BBQ, with Grand Canyon West (702) 736-7511 or (800) 543-3077, P.O. Box 93445, Las Vegas, NV 89193-3445. Same directions, except turn left 5-1/2 miles past cattle guard. Permits may be obtained at Grand Canyon West on the Indian Reservation.

MT. CHARLESTON - Just under an hour drive north on Hwy 95 and west on NV Hwy 157 to 8000 ft. elevation in Toiyabe National Forest, which provides skiing in winter and cool pine picnicking in the summer.
