

Birds on the Battlefield

Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument is one of over 400 sites administered by the National Park Service. Although the primary objective of this park is to preserve and interpret the history and resources associated with the Battle of Little Bighorn, many opportunities exist for bird watching.

The Rocky Mountain Bird Observatory, in conjunction with the National Park Service, conducted avian area searches covering the full extent of Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument. In total, 577 individuals of 47 species were detected during the avian area searches. Breeding behavior was confirmed for four species, strong evidence of breeding was observed for eight species, and moderate evidence of breeding was witnessed for an additional eight species.

Birds listed as "at risk" have either been given this designation by Partners in Flight for Bird Conservation Region 17, or are considered a species of concern in the state of Montana.
