Survey on the implementation of the Seville Strategy

During its 15<sup>th</sup> session, which took place on 711 December 1998, the International Co-ordination Council of the Man and Biosphere Programme decided that given the multitude of activities following the adoption of the Seville Strategy, it would be useful to review its implementation. It also decided to prepare a special session in the year 2000, five years after the initial conference in Seville, in relation with the 16<sup>th</sup> session of the Council.

The next months will therefore be devoted to the evaluation of the implementation of the Seville Strategy with reference to the implementation indicators that have been developed for the international and national levels as well as for the individual Biosphere Reserves.

The present survey has taken up the main indicators and should allow for an overview of the implementation of the Seville Strategy on the national and individual BR levels. At the same time, an analysis will be made of the successes and failures at the international level. To that end, a number of case studies, identified during recent or forthcoming regional meetings, will be analysed to illustrate some crucial aspects of the Strategy in greater detail.

The results from the survey and the analysis at the international level will be submitted to an expert meeting that will be organized in Spain towards the end of October, thanks to the generous invitation of the Spanish MAB Committee. The conclusions of that meeting will then be submitted to the International Co-ordination Council meeting, which has been scheduled for the  $6^{th}$  till the  $10^{th}$  of November at UNESCO headquarters in Paris.

It will be greatly appreciated if you could assist us in collecting the responses to the attached survey by:

- collecting the responses from the Biosphere Reserves in your country and thereafter
- responding directly to the questions concerning the national level, in particular the synthesis of responses and conclusions that appear on the last pages of the survey (pages 9 and 10).

As you will see, the attached survey has taken up a number of the questions that previously have been addressed to you in relation to the EUROMAB meeting in Cambridge. The attached survey, however, is more complete since it addresses the whole of the Strategy and will be sent out to all regions in order to allow for a global view. We apologise for asking you to respond again to some of the questions which you have already answered, but it seems to be the only method to permit a valid comparison between all regions concerned.

It is expected that this review will not only provide an overview of the state of implementation of the Seville Strategy, but also some general orientations for the future. I count on your support and valuable input for the evaluation and would appreciate it if you could send your contribution before 30 August 2000.
