n 1871, Frederick Billings began importing cows directly from the Isle of Jersey. We still have purebred Jerseys-cows known

for their rich milk. Although we've modernized over the years, we still keep sheep and use horses to help with the farm work. The farm is a busy place, with fields, fences, animals and crops to tend, and milking twice daily.







uilt in 1890 as a residence and office for the farm manager and his family, the farm house featured a state-of-the-art Victorian creamery. Late nineteenth century innovations, including water-powered churns, transformed Jersey cream into high grade butter.



We have restored this functional and decorative building to its original 1890s heyday.











ur exhibit galleries are devoted to family farm life in Vermont. The farm home, workshop, and general













Billings Farm & Museum Woodstock, Vermont (802) 457-2355
