Fact: The Stone House served as a wagon stop along the Warrenton Turnpike, an early Virginia toll road.

The Stone House witnessed fighting during First and Second Manassas and served as an aid station to the wounded following both battles. During the Second Battle of Manassas, two wounded Union soldiers, Eugene Geer and Charles Brehm, were taken to the Stone House where they carved their names into the floorboards.
