



Maj. General "Stonewall" Jackson

Born: January 21, 1824 in Clarksburg, VA Died: May 10, 1863 at Guinea Station, VA Thomas Jonathan "Stonewall" Jackson was a Confederate general from Virginia. He earned his famous nickname at the First Battle of Manassas. His sweeping flanking maneuver set the stage for the Confederate victory at Second Manassas, and his bold leadership led to many Southern triumphs. He was accidentally shot by his own men at the Battle of Chancellorsville, and he died on May 10, 1863.
