Log and stone masonry frame, one-story, one-room, rectangular trail shelter; medium pitched "saltbox" gable shake roof over 1.5" x 7" tongue-and-groove cedar sheathing on log beams; stone chimney on gable ridge; whittled log rafters and purlins; log beam supports on gable ends; stone masonry walls with log post and beam framed front facade opening; stone masonry on earth foundation; two interior ridge beams bolted together, ceiling joists, stone masonry fireplace, 8 suspended wood and metal bunk beds, earth floor.

In 1931, trail shelters for use by rangers on patrol and available for hikers were constructed by District Rangers at Lake George, Sunset Park, Mystic Lake and Indian Bar. However, there are no evident remains of the shelter at Indian Bar. In 1940, the Civilian Conservation Corps built this shelter at Indian Bar, one of the two stone trail shelters in the park. It was constructed from plans drawn up by the NPS Branch of Plans and Design in San Francisco, under the supervision of Edwin A. Nickel.

The shelter measures 23' x 25'8", with a floor size of 220 square feet. Average height from floor to ridge is 9'4", highest point is 12'6". Front facade opening is 7' x 10'. One of the numerous park structures built by Civilian Conservation Corps, this facility is one of the two stone trail shelters remaining in Mount Rainier. Both this structure and the stone shelter at Summerland were constructed from plans drawn up by the NPS Branch of Plans and Design, under the supervision of Edwin A. Nickel. Indian Bar Trail Shelter was constructed during the administration of Superintendent O.A. Tomlinson, when a string of patrol cabins and trail shelters were built along the famous Wonderland Trail to accommodate backcountry rangers on patrol, and provide shelter for the hiking public.

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
