# **Mission**

# Introduction

The SdCNHA tells the stories of the people, culture, and environment of more than 3,000 square miles of land in Colorado's San Luis Valley, which encompasses the headwaters of the Rio Grande. It is among the most unique and well-preserved cultural landscapes in the nation, with stunning, beautiful, natural resources and a rich mixture of historic and diverse settlements. The three southern counties of the San Luis Valley: Alamosa, Conejos, and Costilla, form the Heritage Area, which are united by the Rio Grande and its intricate network of tributaries that have guenched the landscapes, communities, and farms of this dry, alpine Valley for centuries.



## **Grants & Projects Completed**

#### MAESTAS BRONZE STATUE





Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area provided funds toward interpretation and education of the Maestas Desegregation Case. A traveling exhibit was housed at the State Capitol in Denver. The life size Maestas Bronze Statue is permanently housed at the Alamosa County Justice Center.

#### CONEJOS RIVER PARTNERSHIP PROJECT

The purpose of the project is to meet aquatic habitat and agricultural needs on the Conejos River through the enhancement of these aquatic habitat, restoration of riparian and wetland habitats, and replacement of aging irrigation infrastructure. Project outcomes include improved aquatic habitat complexity and connectivity, reestablishment of native riparian vegetation, reconnected floodplains, increased alluvial aquifer storage, enhanced natural sediment transport regimes, improved function and efficiency of agricultural diversion structures. As a result, the Conejos River will be better able to meet the needs of the diverse human, agricultural, and ecological communities that depend on it.



#### 2022 CONGRESO DE ACEOUIAS



Congreso de Acequias is a unique event which brings together the acequia community each year to celebrate and strengthen Colorado's oldest farming communities. Acequias are a critical piece of the Heritage Area's living history, supporting the ancestors of those who settled under the Mexican land grants. The Congreso de Acequias was held on May 21, 2022, and approximately 100 community members attended the event. Participants heard from a variety of speakers.

#### **UPPER CULEBRA WATERSHED ASSESSMENT**



The Upper Culebra Watershed
Assessment is a comprehensive
stakeholder process that will assess
the ecologic condition of the Upper
Culebra Watershed. The goal of the
highly leveraged project will be to
identify the extent of ecologic damage
and create a project list that will
ensure the safety of the Hispano
citizens, their historic infrastructure,
and the rich history of the Sangre de
Cristo Land Grant.

#### MAESTAS CASE INTERPRETIVE SIGNS



SdCNHA worked with the Maestas Commemoration Committee to develop signs to bring awareness to the 1914 Francisco Maestas et al. vs George H. Shone et al Educational Desegregation case. This case is one of the country's first successful legal battles against discrimination in schools.

#### LOS CAMINOS ANTIGUOS SIGN REHABILITAION



Alcon Construction Inc. worked to rehabilitate the Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area's interpretive signs along the Los Caminos Scenic and Historic Byway. They proceeded to remove the existing wood posts and frames, replace them with all new lumber to match the existing wooden frames, stain the new wood, clean and repaint the metal interior frames, and lastly install new posts in concrete.



#### **ROOF & PORCH STABILIZATION OF THE WARSHAUER MANSION**

This project was to complete roof stabilization by installing flashing at the chimneys, replacing damaged and missing roofing tiles, installing new gutters and downspouts where they are damaged, and painting the historic fascia, soffits, and rafter tails their original color. Other work to be completed includes rehabilitating the two porches on the east elevation by stabilizing the foundation, repointing the masonry, stabilizing the concrete

#### FOX CREEK CONSERVATION EASEMENT

RIGHT worked with the owners of the beautiful 790-acre Fox Creek Ranch in Conejos County to protect it with a permanent conservation easement. This unique property was homesteaded by the Ruybal Family over 57 years ago and is held by this same family today. All due diligence has been completed and approved by NRCS along with the closing of the conservation easement on August 4, 2022. Upon closing, 821.33 acres of habitat will be protected along the upper reaches of Fox Creek in Conejos County.



#### RIO GRANDE FARM PARK AGRICULTURAL, ENVIRONMENTAL, AND CULTURAL EDUCATION





The San Luis Valley Local Foods Coalition ("LFC") received an SdCNHA Heritage Grant to add a variety of culturally and historically significant elements to the Rio Grande Farm Park's ("RGFP") new education center. These elements will include an horno, which is an outdoor cooking stove traditionally used by the indigenous people of the region, Spanish settlers, and Anglo settlers. Traditional landscaping will also be added, including an adobe wall such as those constructed by Indigenous peoples and Spanish settlers.

### **Youth Programs**

HISTORY FAIR SCHOLARSHIPS



The Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area presented one student with a History Fair Scholarship. Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area provides annual scholarships to students who participate and compete in the Regional History Fair, with projects based on the year's theme.

#### YOUTH LED WALKING TOURS



In 2022 Caminos del Valle-Youth Walking Tours had acquired four local students from across the San Luis Valley ages 15-18. The students chose areas/topics around the Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area that they wanted to lead their tour on. While preparing to give their tours, the kids completed training for public speaking, CPR, and self-defense. With research and trainings completed the students ran three tours around the heritage area

#### YOUTH HERITAGE CAMP



Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area's Heritage Camp was held the summer of 2022 during the week of June 6th - June 9th. This camp includes tours in Alamosa, Costilla, and Conejos County, and on the final day they participated in a Scavenger Hunt while traveling the Los Caminos Scenic and

#### **FIELDTRIP GRANTS**



Sangre de Cristo National Heritage Area offers fieldtrip grants to encourage excursions that foster the study of land and water: local history, heritage, and culture; archaeology; an understanding of where they're from: and the shared natural and human resources.

Southwest Conservation Corps Youth Crews based in Costilla, Coneios, and Alamosa counties completed 10 fieldtrips along with the Sangre de Cristo Heritage Area driving tour during their summer programming. 32 youth total from the 3 counties in addition to 9 supporting staff visited the Baca, Rio Grande Farm Park, SLV Museum, Fort Garland Museum, and Great Sand Dunes National Park & Preserve.
