

Hurricane Ridge

Life on the Edge

Area Information

Hurricane Ridge Visitor Center has exhibits, orientation movie and restrooms year-round. The information desk is staffed in summer and weekends late December to late March. Ranger programs are offered late June to September. A gift shop with snack bar is open mid May to late September and weekends mid December to late March. In winter, the gift shop has snowshoe and ski rentals.

The Hurricane Ridge Road is open 24 hours a day from mid May into October. The rest of the year it opens (weather permitting) primarily on weekends. Call 360-565-3131 for a 24-hour road and weather recording.


Picnic Areas: Picnic Areas A and B (summer only), one mile beyond the visitor center, have restrooms, water and paved trails to tables. In winter, visitors may picnic upstairs in the visitor center.

Camping: The closest vehicle campground is at Heart O' the Hills, 12 miles downhill. Get wilderness camping permits at the Wilderness Information Center, 360-565-3100, in Port Angeles.

Regulations: Please stay on designated trails and do not feed wildlife.

Pets and bicycles are not permitted on paved or dirt trails.

Cirque Rim	Easy paved trail with views of Port Angeles and the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Wheelchair accessible with assistance.	0.5 one way	Under 50 ft.
Big Meadow	Easy paved trail crosses open meadows with views of the Olympics. Wheelchair accessible with assistance.	0.25 one way	Under 50 ft.
High Ridge	Partially paved loop climbs to 360° views and a 0.1 mile dead end spur trail to Sunrise Point.	0.5 mile loop	+220 ft.
Klahhane Ridge	The first 2.8 miles of this trail is on a ridge to a junction with the Klahhane Switchback trail. An additional mile climbs 800 ft. on the Switchback Trail to Klahhane Ridge.	3.8 one way	+250 ft. first 2.8 miles
Hurricane Hill	Paved trail climbs to a panoramic view of mountains and saltwater. The first 0.25 miles is wheelchair accessible with assistance.	1.6 one way	+ 700 ft.
Wolf Creek	Dirt trail descends 8 miles to Whiskey Bend in the Elwha Valley.	8.0 one way	- 3,772 ft.
Little River	Dirt trail descends 8 miles to the Little River Road.	8.0 one way	- 4,073 ft.
Hurricane Hill/ Elwha	Dirt trails descends from Hurricane Hill through meadows and steep forested switchbacks to the start of the Whiskey Bend Road.	6.0 one way	-5,250 ft.
