Record Trees in Olympic National Park

The record size trees of these species have been found in Olympic National Park. The trees are recognized by The American Forestry Association as the largest living specimens of the species in their list of approximately 750 National Champions. The following list gives the size and location of Olympic's record trees:

Alaska Cedar (Chamaecyparis nootkatensis): Circumference 451 inches Height 124 feet Spread 27 feet Total Point 582



Location: Quinault Sub-District. Approximately 40' north of Big Creek Trail. Approximately 1 mile east of Three Lakes, at approximately 3,000 feet elevation.

Location: About 300 feet east/southeast of Cream Lake which is located at the head of the Hoh River drainage. There is no maintained trail into the area.

Location: Up Queets River Trail (ford river) 2.4 miles to old Kloochman Rock Trail at Coal Creek; turn left at the junction. The big fir is 0.20 mile along this trail. There is a sign where you leave the trail and one at the tree. The trail is on the north side of the river.
