Cave Tour Schedule

Last weekend in April to Memorial Day	10 am - 4 pm*
Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day	9 am - 6 pm
After Labor Day to Columbus Day	10 am - 5 pm
After Columbus Day to first Sunday in November	10 am - 4 pm

Early November to late April: No Cave Tours offered

Fees

16 years and younger \$6.00 per person 17 years and older \$8.50 per person Children must be 42 inches tall to go on tour (see below).

About the Cave Tour — 15 person limit per tour

The 90-minute cave tour is a winding adventure inside of a mountain! Special kid-focused family and speleo-science tours are offered at posted times in the summer.

Be Prepared for your Cave Tour

The route is moderately strenuous and not recommended for people with heart, breathing or walking problems. The 0.6-mile (1 km) route includes more than 500 steep, uneven and wet steps as well as frequent bending and twisting while walking. The temperature inside is approximately $44^{\circ}\mathrm{F}$ (7°C) year round. Wear warm clothing and hiking shoes. No backpacks or tripods permitted due to low ceilings and narrow passageways. The cave has lighting; no personal flashlights.

Children

For safety, to go on a full cave tour children must be at least 42 inches tall. Children may not be carried through the cave.

Help us Protect our Bats!

White Nose Syndrome is devastating bat populations throughout the eastern U.S. and Canada. To prevent it spreading to the Oregon Caves, do not bring clothes or equipment used in other caves or mines east of the Rocky Mountains. Expect clothing and equpment screening at the Monument. Only the first room of the cave tour is accessible to person with mobility impairments, including wheelchairs. People with knee injuries or similar concerns are not advised to take the tour.

Arrive early to avoid long waits, especially during July and August.
