"The Marble Halls of Oregon"

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The OREGON CAVES "Marble Halls of Oregon," a National Monument, are in the Siskiyou Mountains 4000 feet above sea level.

The caves comprise a series of natural passages and chambers, extending through the Marble rock, far into the heart of the mountain.

The formations are wonderful beyond description.

Courteous and instructive guides make regular trips through the Caves during the summer. The trip requires about two and a half hours.

The Cave mountain is covered with a heavy forest of mammoth Douglas Fir and the surroundings are very scenic.

The Caves are 50 miles south of Grants Pass, Oregon, and 80 miles north of Crescent City, California, via the Redwood Highway.
