The community of Cedargrove includes perhaps ten to twenty structures in a curve of the Current River. Most of the buildings are of mill sawn lumber and date from early in this century. Expecially notable is a schoolhouse built of cave formations.

The site is subject to vandalism and destruction. In April 1969 most of the structures were still standing. In the last four months (April to August 1969) several other buildings have been vandalized, destroyed or dismantled.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

As a small community within the boundaries of Ozark National Scenic Riverways, Cedargrove would lend itself to being used for the interpretation of Ozark culture at the beginning of the twentieth century. Established in the late 1880s or early 1890s, the town filed its application for a post office on August 7, 1891. There were several mills located at Cedargrove and by the 1920s it was a community of twenty families with a blacksmith shop and two stores plus a school. In 1957 only four families remained and by 1969 the town was deserted. Some destruction has occurred, but in April 1969 there were a number of buildings still standing.

There are two parts to the town that should be preserved. Latitude and longitude for the larger southern part is given on page 84. The readings for the northern section are given below:
