DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Charles Lessig, Historical Architect from the Midwest Regional Office, visited the site in early July and October. In his memorandum of October 14, 1969, Assistant Regional Director, Operations, Midwest Regional Office, Lessig made the following comments. The 1 1/2 story cabin has a stone foundation and is built of vertical pine logs with a pine floor. The gable ends are covered with wood shingles and some of the original or early roof shingles are still visible under the metal roof that now covers the structure. The structure is about 33 feet square and has a large stone fireplace in the center of the building. The walls and ceiling are finished with 1 x 3" tongue and groove pine boards in beautiful condition.

The site is accessible only by boat.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built in 1913 by the Pulltite Land Corporation comprized of seven men. The survivors have picked up the shares or interest of the deceased. At present there is only one of the seven still alive. The Pulltite Land Corporation may have been one of several speculative companies that entered the region toward the end of the era of the big lumber companies.
