Dear Dr. Ackerman:

The letter of January 11 to the Secretary signed by Mrs. Genevieve L. Ackerman and yourself requesting preservation of Lake Isabella, California, as a prime recreation area has been referred to us for reply.

We understand that Lake Isabella is a body of impounded water located between Kernville and Isabella, but are not intimately familiar with its values as a recreation area.

The National Park Service is actively studying the Nation's outdoor recreation resources for the purpose of identifying those areas which are of such quality as to warrant their protection in public ownership, whether it be by a national, state, or local government agency. Therefore, we are sending a copy of your letter to our Regional Office in San Francisco, which is responsible for the studies in California and other nearby states. If they are not already familiar with Lake Isabella, this will call it to their attention.
