At any rate, two year ago, I went over board, I shut down the ousiness with which I was supporting these ventures, and of course my family of ten and opened two museums. One folded completely. The other is now an established incorporation(non-profit) and I hope it will remain and import not educational institution. However, these broke me entirely.

Now the life history out of the way. I have over forty truck loads of ertifacts. California Indain and early historical valifornia. Dear Mr. Van Zant:

Secretary Udall has referred your letter of April 1 to the National Park Service since it is this agency which is charged with administering those historical and archeological sites under the care of the Department of the Interior.

Your project is indeed an interesting one, and we wish you every success. Unfortunately, the National Park Service has no authority to expend funds for assistance in the development of museums or historical or archeological areas not included in the National Park System. In order to qualify for inclusion in the System, a site or building must be of outstanding importance to the nation as a whole, and this we fear would not be the case with the area which you have selected.

We are sorry to be of so little help on a project which we realize is of the greatest importance to you. We wonder, however, if you have discussed this with the staff of the California Division of Beaches and Parks in Sacramento. This organization is one of the very best in the nation. Since they act upon a state level, it might be more likely that they could visit you and perhaps assist you than could the National Park NOW Service.
