Stay the night!

Oak Ridge Campground is a 100-site, wooded camping facility. Each site is capable of accommodating two tents (or one RV and one tent) for one family unit or a group of up to six people. The campground is open year-round. Each site has a parking slip, picnic table, grill/fire pit and lantern post. Restrooms feature sinks and flush toilets, and the "B" loop restroom has showers. Rangers provide programs and evening campfire talks during summer weekends at the centrally located amphitheater.

The campground has 3 loops:

A-Loop: Tents & RVs (no hookups) First Come, First Served

<u>B-Loop:</u> Tents & RVs (no hookups) Summer - Reservations Only (recreation.gov) Winter - First Come, First Served

<u>C-Loop:</u> Tents Only Summer - Reservations Only (recreation.gov) Winter First Come, First Served

About Prince William Forest Park

Prince William Forest Park, a unit of the National Park Service, is a 15,000+ acre piedmont forest preserving a variety of natural and historical resources 35 miles south of Washington, D.C. The park offers many recreational opportunities, including 37 miles of hiking trails, over 21 miles of bicycle-accessible roads and trails and numerous campgrounds. The park preserves 5 historic cabin camps built by the Civilian Conservation Corps during the 1930s and used by the Office of Strategic Services during World War II.

Reserving a Campsite

During the winter, all sites at Oak Ridge Campground are first-come, first served, and therefore cannot be reserved. Visitors may pay at the campground honor system or during business hours 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.at the visitor center.

During the high-season, campsites in B- and C-Loop are available by advance reservation only. You can make a reservation by visiting www.recreation.gov or calling 1-877-444-6777. A-Loop remains first-come, first served year-round.

Fees

There is a camping fee of \$20 per night, per site (\$10 for Interagency Senior and Access Pass holders). Please note that this camping fee is in addition to the \$5.00 per vehicle entrance fee. The entrance fee is good for 7 consecutive days visit to the park. The park annual pass provides one year of access to the park for \$20.00. There are no group or non-profit discounts available.

Rules and Regulations

Campsite capacity is 2 tents (or one RV and one tent, or one RV and one dining canopy) and 6 people or one family unit per site. Trailers and fifth wheels are limited to 26 feet in length and motor homes to 32 feet. Campers may collect dead and downed wood less than six inches in diameter within the campground for use and consumption during their stay. Quiet hours are between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Fireworks are prohibited. Report all emergencies to a park ranger. For a law enforcement concern, please contact a park ranger or call Park Dispatch toll free at 866-677-6677, or call 9-1-1 for emergencies.
