Subject: Annual Report for Calendar Year 1967

The purpose of this memorandum is to present the annual report of the United States Park Police for the calendar year 1967. Some of the important elements are summarized below.

The United States Park Police Force is responsible for providing protection and visitor services, prevention and detection of crime and enforcement of the park regulations and other applicable statutes in the Washington Metropolitan park areas of the National Capital Region, National Park Service. Providing protection, helpful services, reduction in crime and the traffic accident rate, and supervision of peak-hour traffic are among the major fundamental objectives of park police operations.

Total visitation in the National Capital Region has steadily increased over the last five years and has been estimated at 21,400,814 persons during 1967. Visitation at special events held within the Park System has been estimated at 3,117,891 persons. The volume of traffic using park roads has increased to an all-time high.

Total major criminal offenses reported increased 356 over the calendar year 1966, with 1,092 offenses reported for 1967 as opposed to 841 offenses for 1966. Part of this increase can be attributed to a better reporting system with use of machine records. It should be noted that in the area of serious crimes, less than half of the 1,092 offenses reported were crimes of violence against the person. The others were larceny offenses of various types including thefts from parked automobiles. Out of 53,886 major offenses reported by the police departments for the entire District of Columbia for 1967, only 918 of these were perpetrated within the National Capital Park System. While there was an increase in the number of serious crimes committed (including thefts), the total number of some 500 crimes against the person is less than one for each park reservation which we patrol in a very extensive geographical area situated within three jurisdictions.

Traffic accidents increased by 175 with 2,756 reported as opposed to 2,581 in 1966. Eleven traffic deaths were reported as opposed to 23 traffic deaths during the previous year which is a decrease of twelve. The traffic accident frequency rate for motorists using park roads is only slightly higher than the previous year, with a substantial reduction in the number of traffic deaths. Considering the increase in the use of park roads which causes added congestion, the accident frequency rate does not reflect a very significant rise.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

Sergeant Lydia H. Michos

In recognition of exceptional service in the Department of the Interior. Sergeant Michos served with the U. S. Park Police since 1942, after serving more than eight years with the National Parks, Buildings and Reservations and with the National Capital Parks. She held the position of Officer in Charge of the Records Branch until her recent retirement.

SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE AWARD

Sergeant Richard A. Valentine

Award for superior performance of duties as Officer-In-Charge, Horse Mounted Patrol and Dog Patrol.

Edward Brantley

Award for superior performance of duties as guard assigned to the Interior Department Parking Lot.

SPECIAL ACT AWARDS

Sergeant Pat. W. Cowley

Liaison Officer between Park Police and PWF and GWMP - Special Act Award for his perseverance and extra effort he spent in the project and plans which led to the removal of certain unsightly spots within the park.

Private Carlton H. Robbins

Special Act Award for performance above and beyond the call of duty, when in the face of personal danger, he rescued a man from a burning vehicle on the Baltimore-Washington Parkway.

COMMENDABLE SERVICE AWARDS

Mrs. Gertrude E. Wilson

upon retirement after more than 23 years of service with the Federal Government, joined U. S. Park Police in August 1944. Was serving as juvenile officer and crime photo assistant when she retired in June 1966.

James J. Lyons

upon retirement after more than 35 years of service in Federal Government. Joined Park Police in June 1940 and held the position of Detective Sergeant when he retired in July 1966.

Louis R. Sepulveda

upon retirement after a long career with the U. S. Park Police. Joined Park Police in July 1943. Served as a footman, cruiserman, motorcycle patrolman, and at the time of his retirement was serving as a horseman.

Joseph S. Street

upon retirement after 23 years of service in the Federal Government, joined the United States Park Police in February 1952. He served as a footman, and as a radio car patrolman, the position he held when he retired on March 31, 1967.

Julian C. Vass

upon retirement after 24 years of service in the Federal Government, joined the United States Park Police in October 1953. He served as footman, a cruiserman, a plainclothesman and was later promoted to the rank of Detective, the position he held when he retired on July 31, 1967.

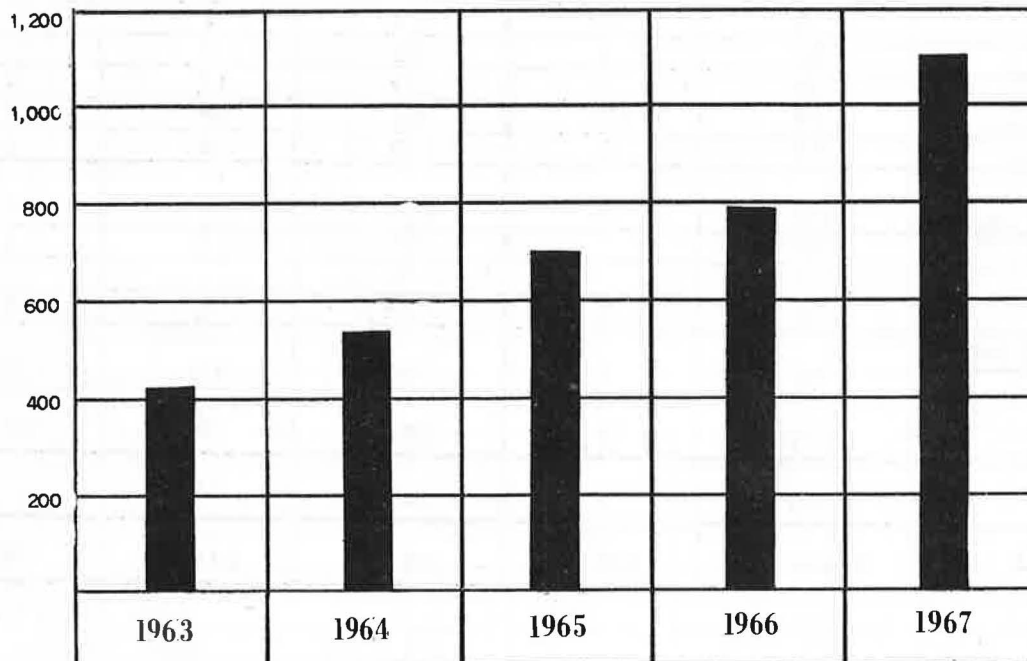

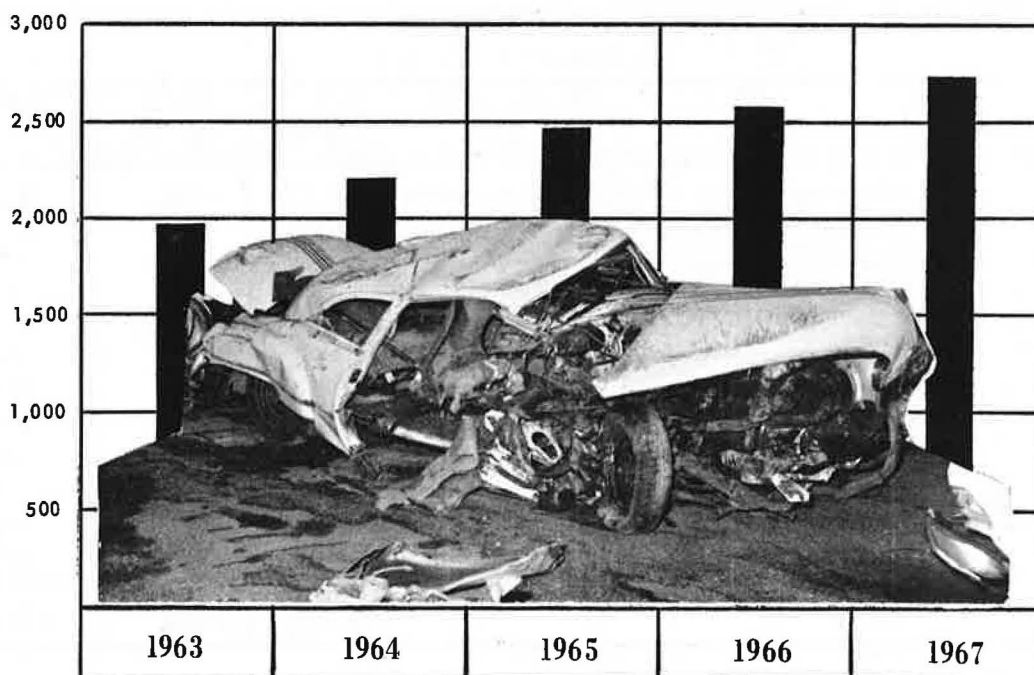

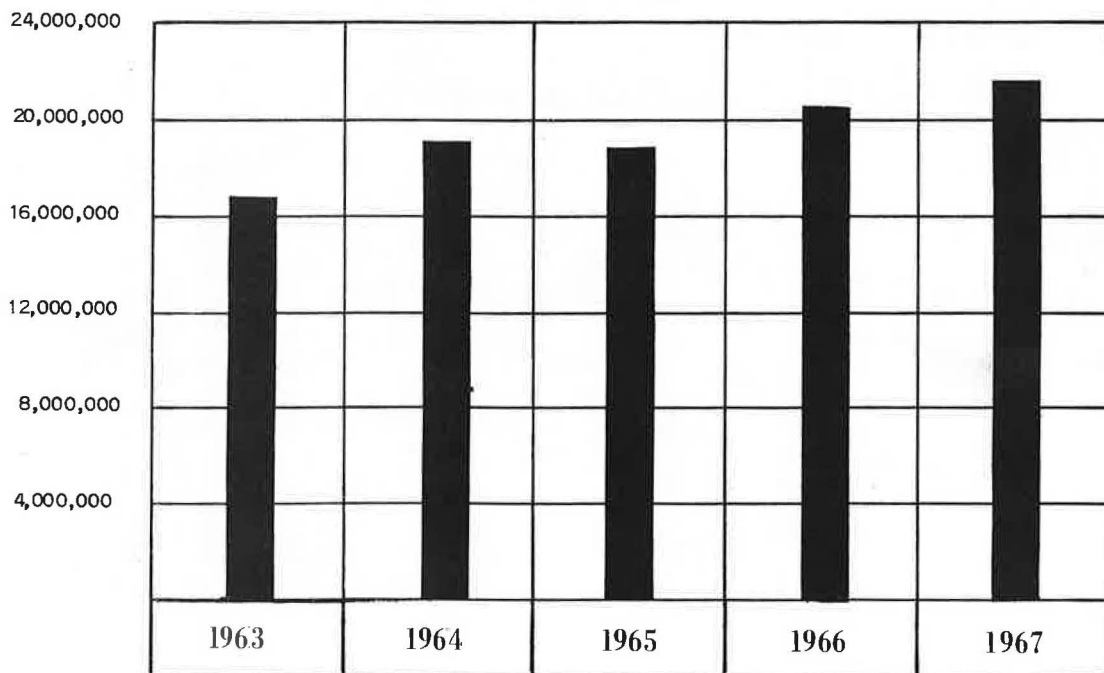

FIVE YEAR COMPARISON OF VISITATION

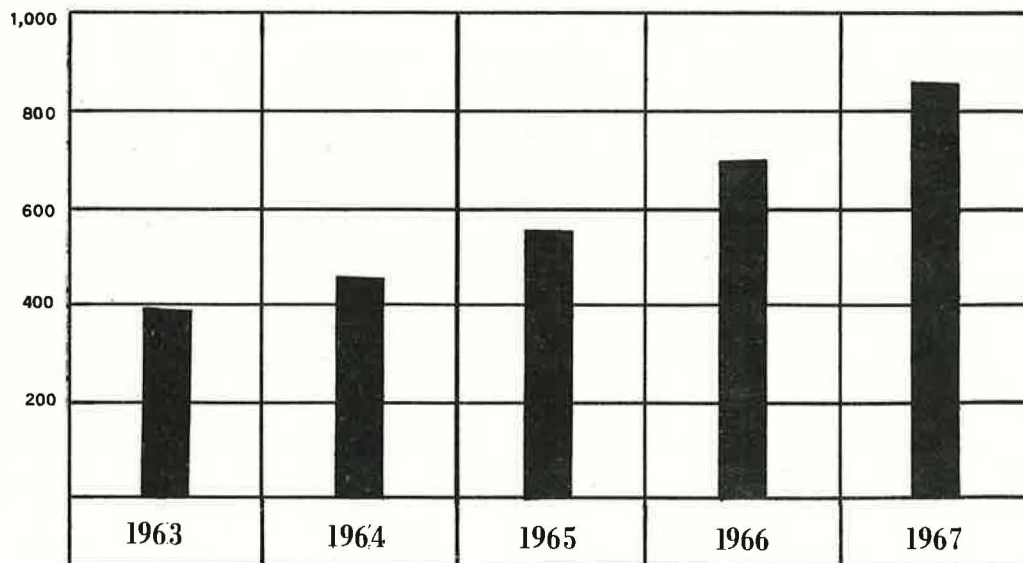


SPECIAL OCCASIONS AND EVENTS
