Natural sounds are vital to the natural functioning of park ecosystems. Studies suggest that the acoustical environment is important in a number of ways including:

Intra-species communication
Territory establishment, finding desirable habitat
Courtship and mating
Nurturing and protecting young
Predation and predator avoidance
Effective use of habitat

Soundscapes are important to visitors and can provide an environment that:

Is free from human made noise
Is rich with opportunities to experience solitude,
quietude, and the sounds of nature.
Tells a unique cultural or historic story
