

As you walk 3/4 of a mile along a part of the Union lines, the ranger will discuss the events that changed the tide of battle at Stones River. Programs offered Tuesday at 10:00 AM. (60 minutes)



The Pioneer's Last Stand

A talk that focuses on one of the more unique units on the battlefield and their pivotal role in the outcome. Program offered Thursday at 2:00 PM and Saturday at 11:00 AM. (30 minutes)

Remembering Stones River

Walk through the Stones River National Cemetery as the ranger discusses the many ways we have attempted to honor the men who served during the Civil War. Programs offered Thursday at 10:00 AM and Sunday at 3:00 PM. (60 minutes)

The Slaughter Pen

Take a short 1/8 mile walk into one of the deadliest and most crucial spots on the battlefield. Program offered Sunday at 1:30 PM. (30 minutes)

The most asked and most complicated question of the Civil War. Discuss why men from both sides felt the need to leave their lives and go to war, and discover their reasons for continuing to face the carnage and hardships of a soldier's life.
