



The Mutiny – Lt. Roger Terry, Court-Martialed

In 1945, Tuskegee Airman Lt. Roger Terry was arrested at Freeman Field, Indiana for trying to eat in the white-only officers club. He was court martialed, kicked out of the Army, and lost his right to vote. In 1995, 50 years later, President Bill Clinton pardoned his court martial and restored his right to vote.
