A BILL

To create the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial Redwood Forest, and for other purposes.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- That in order to provide a fitting memorial to Franklin
- Delano Roosevelt, who as President of the United States
- guided his country through the storms of the great depression
- and the Second World War, and whose vision inspired the
- United Nations, first, as a wartime alliance of all free peoples,
- and later as a permanent world organization for the enforcement of peace and the furtherance of social justice in inter-
- national affairs; and to establish and perpetuate upon the
- lands hereinafter described the conditions of forest protection

1 and use most conducive to the furtherance of commerce among the States, provision for the national defense, and

the advancement of the general welfare, there is hereby

- created the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial Redwood
- Forest, herein called the forest.
- SEC. 2. The forest shall be comprised of lands consti-
- tuting the natural habitat of the most nearly immortal of all
- living things, the species of tree scientifically known as Sequoia sempervirens and more generally as the California
- Coast Redwood, herein called the redwoods, and such other
- trees as may occur therewith, situated within the counties
- of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, and Sonoma, in the
- State of California; the exterior boundaries of the forest being set forth in the exterior boundary description annexed
- hereto and hereby made part of this Act.
- SEC. 3. The forest shall be forever open and accessible
- to all the people for their use, enjoyment, and benefit; and
- to that end the Secretary of Agriculture, herein called the Secretary, is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate
- with the recreation industries of the State of California; to
- provide suitable roads, trails, recreation areas, camp sites, and other facilities within the forest, which shall be open to the
- public on equal terms; and to train and provide personnel whose duty it shall be to cooperate with and assist visitors
- and to aid the people in the use and enjoyment of the forest:
