

U.S.S. Cairo Strong but not Invincible

Ironclad gunboats were a new weapon in the Civil War. Cairo was critical to Union operations along the Mississippi. On December 12, 1862, while clearing mines in the Yazoo River, near Vicksburg, Cairo struck a mine, sinking in 12 minutes—the first armored warship sunk by a mine. Cairo was raised in 1964 and is now restored.
