- (2) DEVELOP AN UNDERSTANDING AND APPRECIATION OF OUR NATURAL ENVIRONMENT AND HERITAGE.






## Crystal Creek

Crystal Creek Backcountry

Campground is located off highway 299W approximately one mile

west of the French Gulch turnoff. Follow the Crystal Creek

road for 3.4 miles and turn

left on a small gravel road

leading down to the campsite.

Formerly a trailer camp headquarters for pipeline

construction in this area, this campsite has been improved by the 1976 Youth Conservation Corps, with the help of the National Park Service.

This campground has adequate sleeping and parking facilities for 12 - 15 people. Restroom facilities are available and two spigots furnish fresh spring

water for drinking.

Beautiful Crystal Creek
flows parallel to the campsite. In this idyllic setting, cares and worries seem
to slip away. Only you can
preserve these features.
