


Easy Access to Lower Yosemite Fall







Trailers and motor homes are prohibited on the Mariposa Grove Road from the South Entrance to Mariposa Grove.

Free Mariposa Grove & **Wawona Shuttle Bus**

The shuttle bus stops at the Wawona Store, South Entrance, and Mariposa Grove. Shuttles operate throughout the day beginning at 9:00 a.m. Last shuttle leaves the Grove at 6:00 p.m. Visitors may park at the Wawona Store to board the shuttle bus. Due to narrow roads and very limited parking, visitors are strongly encouraged to use this free bus service to help alleviate congestion and lengthy parking delays.

Yosemite's Other **Sequoia Groves**

Tuolumne Grove

The Tuolumne Grove of Giant Sequoias is near Crane Flat at the intersection of the Big Oak Flat Road (Highway 120 West) and the Tioga Road. The former route of the Big Oak Flat Road leads downhill from Crane Flat into the Tuolumne Grove of Big Trees, a cluster of about 25 sequoias. Now closed to cars, this 2-mile (3.2 km) round-trip has an elevation change of 500 feet (150 meters). The downhill walk is relatively easy, though it is moderately strenuous on the uphill return. Once in the Tuolumne Grove, there is an easy half-mile, self-guiding nature trail.

Merced Grove

Yosemite's quietest stand of sequoias is the Merced Grove, accessible only on foot. It's a 4-mile roundtrip hike into the grove from the Big Oak Flat Road (Highway 120 West). Located 3.5 miles north of Crane Flat or 4.5 miles south of the Big Oak Flat entrance, the trailhead is marked by a post labeled B-10 and a road sign. Allow 3 hours for the round-trip hike to this group of about 20 sequoias.



Night Sky Information

Take advantage of the opportunities in Yosemite to view the wonders of the night sky. Here are some sights to look for while you are out during the night hours.



August 12 Full Moon rises in the east-southeast after twilight. Called the Grain Moon, or Green Corn Moon. After it has risen, Mars will be the bright orange planet to the lower left. If you are adventurous, you can stay up and watch the Moon and Mars draaw closer together as they cross the sky for the rest of the night.

August 13 Moon rise is around 9:30 p.m., with Mars to it's right. The brilliance of the full Moon will interfere with the peak showing of the Perseid meteor shower.

August 14 Mercury will be visible west, just above the horizon, about $^{1}/_{2}$ minutes after sunset.

August 15 & 16 Star Party at Glacier Point. San Francisco Amateur Astronomers. Meet at 8:30 p.m.August 22 & 23 Star Party at Glacier Point. Mt. Diablo Astronomy Society. Meet at 8:30 p.m.

August 23 Night owls can catch the waning crescent Moon rising at 2:45 a.m. Saturn will appear below or to its lower right.

August 24 Look for Uranus tonight, which will appear as a small, greenish star in the southwestern quadrant of Aquarius. Binoculars will help The Perseid meteir shower ends thisnight.
