





Wawona & Mariposa Grove

Wawona Information Station at Hill's Studio

Opens May 4 Thursday - Sunday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Beginning May 25 Daily 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Hill's Studio is located on the grounds of the Wawona Hotel. The station offers information about park activities, Wilderness permits, trail information, and maps. Walk from the hotel or park at the Wawona Store parking area and follow the path up the hill. For more information call 209/375-9531. &

Pioneer Yosemite History Center

Go back to a time of horse-drawn wagons, a covered bridge, and log cabins. Explore Yosemite's history and learn how Yosemite was the inspiration for national parks across America and around the world. The center is always open, and interpretive signs and brochures are available. &

Mariposa Grove

Located at Yosemite's southern end, the Mariposa Grove is the park's largest stand of giant sequoias, with about 500 trees. Allow 1½ hours driving time from Yosemite Valley to reach the grove. A few giant sequoias are visible from the

parking area. Trails into the grove extend uphill from the far end of the parking lot, and interpretive signs between the trailhead and the California Tree offer a self-guiding tour. Written translations in German, French, Spanish, and Japanese are available at the trailhead.

Trailers are prohibited on the Mariposa Grove Road. Private vehicles longer than 23 feet may not use this road during the hours of shuttle operation (see below).

FREE MARIPOSA GROVE & WAWONA SHUTTLE

The shuttle bus stops at the Wawona Store, South Entrance, and Mariposa Grove. Visitors may park at the Wawona Store to board the bus. Shuttles operate beginning at 9:00 a.m., and the last shuttle leaves the grove at 6:00 p.m., or after the last tour. Please use this free bus service to help reduce congestion and parking delays.

Mariposa Grove Museum

Opens May 11 weekends only

Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (closed for lunch). Located in the upper part of the Mariposa Grove, the museum offers information and displays on giant sequoias. &

Big Oak Flat & Sequoia Groves


8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (closed for lunch). The center offers Wilderness permits, bear canister rental, and backpacking information.

Tuolumne Grove

This cluster of about 25 sequoias is near Crane Flat at the intersection of Big Oak Flat and Tioga roads. Walk one mile (with a 500-ft. drop in elevation) into the grove along the former route of the Big Oak Flat Road, now closed to cars. The trip is moderately strenuous on the uphill return. Within the Tuolumne Grove there is an easy, half-mile, self-guiding nature trail.

Merced Grove

Yosemite's quietest stand of sequoias is the Merced Grove, a group of about 20 trees accessible only on foot. It's a four-mile roundtrip hike or ski (about three hours) into the grove from Big Oak Flat Road (Highway 120 West). Located 3½ miles north of Crane Flat and 4½ miles south of the Big Oak Flat Entrance, the trailhead is marked by a road sign and a post labeled B-10.

Parsons Memorial Lodge, McCauley Cabin, and Soda Springs

This historic area is only accessible by walking. There are two trails, both flat and both ½-mile long. Soda Springs are small naturally carbonated springs that often attract birds and deer at sunrise and sunset.

Tuolumne Meadows Wilderness Center

Open 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (closed for lunch). Located just off Tioga Road, along the road to Tuolumne Lodge, the center offers trail information, Wilderness permits, bear canister rentals, maps, and guidebooks. &
