Zion National Park gets over 3,300 people spending the night in the Virgin River Narrows each year. They all go to the bathroom. We need your help to keep these campsites looking and smelling nice. Here's how you can help.

The Restop 2

Because more people are using the backcountry, we are exploring sanitary ways to maintain pristine trails and campsites.

The Restop 2 is a lightweight, sanitary way to pack out human waste. The bag within-a-bag design, with zip lock closure, securely contains waste and odor, while the special blend of enzymes instantly begins to break down waste turning it into a deodorized gel. The bag and contents are safe for landfills and may be deposited in the trash—no special receptacle is needed.


Using the Restop 2



Feel the urge.



Find a scenic place to "go." Dig a 6-8" cat hole and line the hole with the bag to give it support.



Aim and fire. Make sure the contents come in contact with the enzyme. The enzyme in the bag will begin the decomposition process. Toilet paper may be put inside the bag too.



Zip closed to ensure an odor free and leak free carry out.
