
Zion





In 1997 visitation was 2.4 million and increasing. The shuttle system was established to eliminate traffic and parking problems, protect vegetation, and restore tranquility to Zion Canyon.

The Springdale Shuttle loop will stop at six locations in Springdale and the Zion Canyon Shuttle loop will stop at eight locations in the park. The transfer between loops is made at the Zion Canyon Visitor Center. You may get on and off as often as you like. Riding the shuttle is free.

Parking

Park in Springdale and ride the shuttle to the park, or park at the Zion Canyon Visitor Center.

Schedule

Shuttles will operate daily begining at 6:30 a.m. every 30 minutes, increasing to every 15 minutes and then, during the busy part of the day, every 6 to 8 minutes. Toward evening shuttle times will scale back to 15 minutes, then to 30 minutes. The last bus will leave the Zion Canyon Visitor Center at 9:30 p.m. The schedule is subject to change. A complete round trip will take a minimum of 90 minutes. Only the scenic drive is closed to private vehicles; all other roads in the park remain open to private vehicles.

What to Bring

For a day-trip on the shuttle, you should take:

Sunscreen / hat / sunglasses Camera / binoculars Dress for the weather and bring everything you need for a day in the park.
