# Alaska Peninsula and Becharof National Wildlife Refuges



Alaska Peninsula and Becharof National Wildlife Refuges are accessed through King Salmon, a small community 300 miles southwest of Anchorage. The Refuges are accessible only by plane, boat, or rugged hiking. Visitors can charter flights into the Refuges or rent boats out of King Salmon. While in King Salmon visitors can explore exhibits, plan trips, and attend nature programs at the Refuge Visitor Center near the airport. On the Refuges, visitors may explore unique geologic formations such as volcanic gases seeping through cracked rocks, hot springs, and 900 foot wide craters.
