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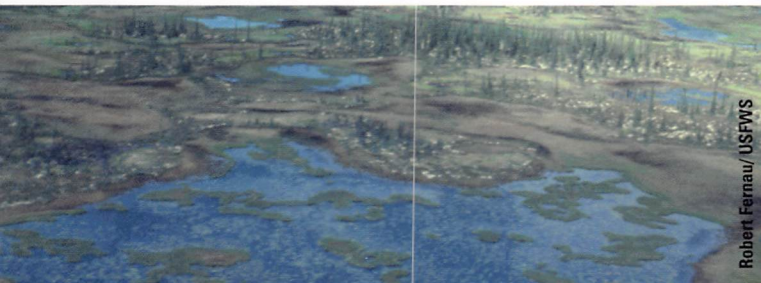


Innoko National Wildlife Refuge is one of the most important waterfowl breeding areas in Interior Alaska. At Innoko, visitors can float a meandering river, hunt a moose, or watch the Iditarod race zoom by just outside the Refuge boundary. Visitors can reach the Refuge by taking a commercial flight from Anchorage to McGrath, and then chartering a float plane.
