National Wildlife Refuge



Float the winding Nowitna River between gently rolling hills past sandbars dotted with flocks of white-fronted geese.



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Nowitna National Wildlife Refuge is located 150 miles west of Fairbanks. Visitors can take commercial flights from Fairbanks to Ruby or Tanana and then charter a flight into the Refuge. Most visitors boat or float the Nowitna River, a National Wild and Scenic River, that winds through rolling terrain and past lakes and wetlands. The upper section of the Nowitna is particularly popular as it passes through a scenic canyon. The Refuge is one of many Alaskans' favorite spots for moose hunting.
