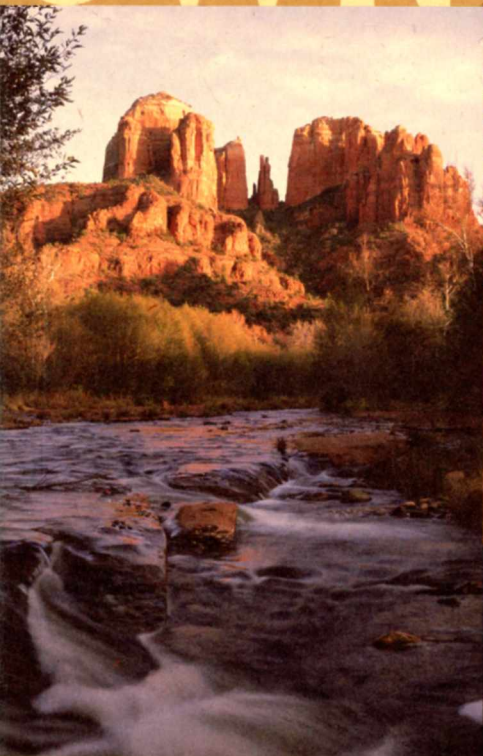

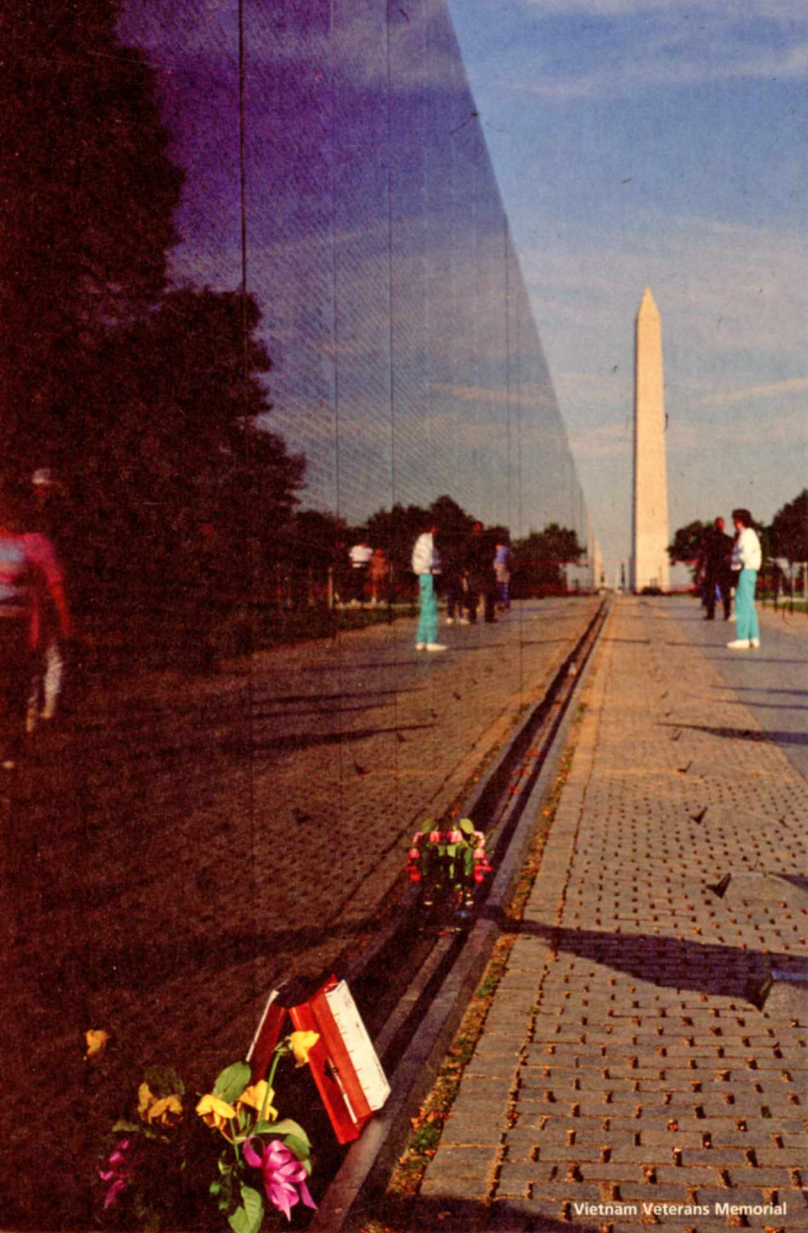

Your National Parks Pass

The National Parks Pass is your official entry pass to enjoying America's National Parks—places like Yellowstone, the Everglades and Acadia as well as hundreds of other Parks, historic sites, battlefields, recreation areas, and seashores across America. There are more than 380 different places in all to choose from!

The 2003 National Parks Pass provides admission to all National Parks requiring an entry fee. The Pass is valid for one full year from the last day of the month in which it is first used. For per vehicle entrance fees, the Pass will admit you and accompanying passengers in a single, private, noncommercial vehicle. At those Parks where a per-person entrance fee is charged, the Pass will admit you, your spouse, parents, and children.

With your Parks Pass and Owner's Manual, opportunities for adventure, enjoyment and lasting memories in the National Parks are just a visit away. What will you see in 2003?

Important Notes



When you see the Parks Pass icon in this Owner's Manual it indicates that the Park requires an entry fee and that your Pass will provide admission in lieu of this fee.

When you see the (HQ) abbreviation in this Owner's Manual it indicates that the city listing corresponds with a separate headquarters office for the Park; it is not a geographic reference point. For example, the city listing for Saint Croix Island IHS in Maine (Map 1) is Bar Harbor, which refers to the HQ office in Acadia National Park. Therefore Acadia would be the primary point of contact for information on Saint Croix Island IHS.

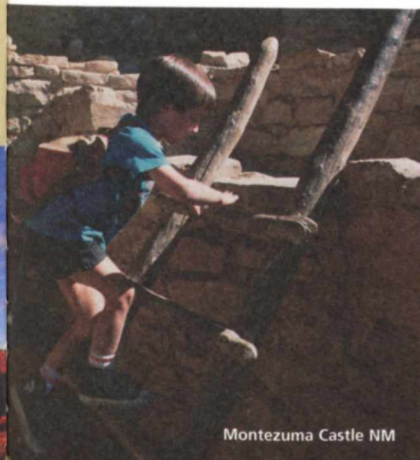

Your Fees at Work

More than 80% of Pass proceeds go straight into vital Park programs. These programs help to:

- Restore plant habitat like native prairie ecosystems in Badlands and Bent's Old Fort.
- Protect wildlife, including the Big Horn Sheep population at Arches and Canyonlands, the Spotted Owl in Yosemite and endangered fish species at John Day Fossil Beds.
- Develop educational exhibits and materials to add to your Park experience in places like Sleeping Bear Dunes, Fort Davis, and Joshua Tree.
- Preserve sites and monuments that illustrate America's history in places like Walnut Canyon and Capitol Reef.

Calling all Kids

National Parks are America's biggest classrooms! They provide places to learn about history, culture, and nature. Park Rangers, of course, take care of our Parks and let us know what there is to see and do. Through the Junior Ranger program kids can become Park Rangers themselves. There's a lot to learn about in our Parks—from Eisenhower National Historic Site, where kids can become Junior Secret Service Agents, to the Grand Canyon, where aspiring naturalists can explore the Park's ecosystem and landscape. Kids will be officially sworn in as Junior Rangers and presented with certificates and badges after completing the program activities. There are over 240 National Parks that offer Junior Ranger programs, so be sure to keep that in mind when planning your next Park trip.

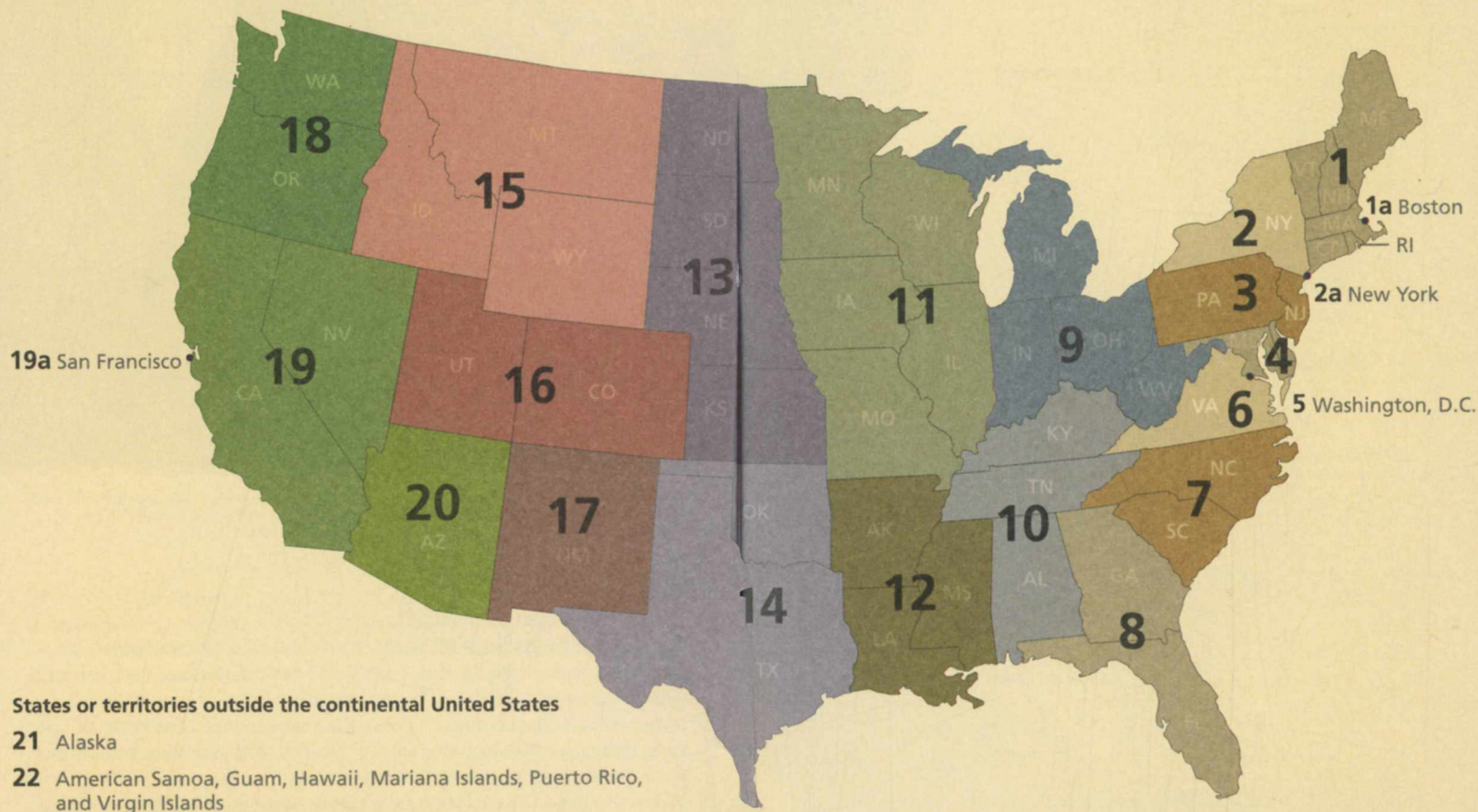

What will you see? Maine is a natural choice for Park lovers with the rocky shores, lush forests and scenic villages in and around **Acadia National Park**. After a day of outdoor fun, be sure to stop by for a popover at Jordan Pond House—a local favorite. Early risers can watch the sun come up from atop Cadillac or Sargent Mountains. Before trip's end, allow an extra day or two to journey to Katahdin and the northern boundary of the 2,168-mile-long **Appalachian National Scenic Trail**.

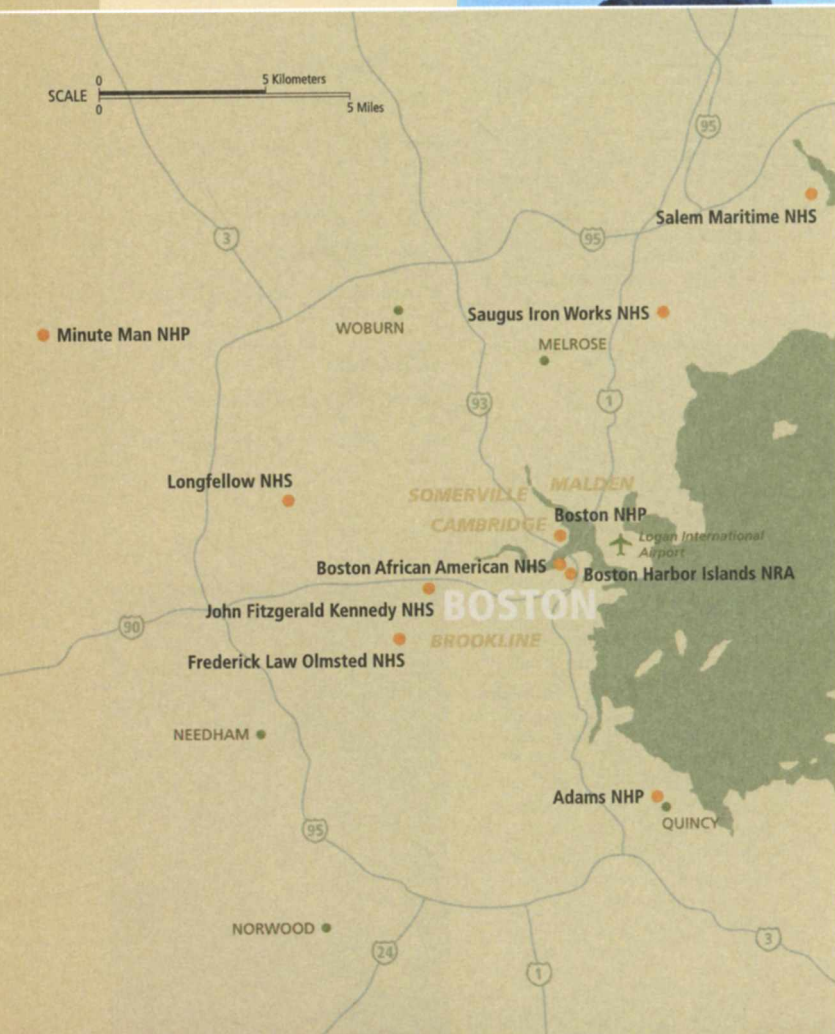

What will you see? Watch history unfold at the Constitution Day Celebration at **Adams National Historical Park**. Visitors take on roles of delegates to the Constitutional Convention and debate the fate of a nation. Follow this with a visit to the **Boston National Historical Park** and Freedom Trail for highlights of the city's Revolutionary War role. From there, move on to **Minute Man National Historical Park**, which preserves sites, structures and landscapes associated with the opening battles of the American Revolution. Nearby you can see **Longfellow House National Historic Site**, former residence of one of the world's foremost poets, scholars and educators, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow.

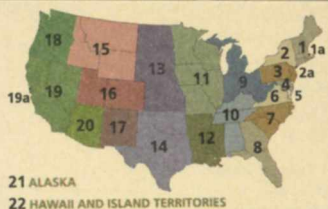

What will you see? The upper Hudson River in New York State offers abundant natural beauty and striking vistas. It's also the site of **Saratoga National Historical Park** where one of the key battles in the American Revolution occurred. Here American forces defeated and caused the surrender of British troops, a major turning point in the Revolution. Make a day of touring the Battlefield, visiting the General Philip Schuyler House, and snapping photos at Saratoga Monument in the aptly named village of Victory.

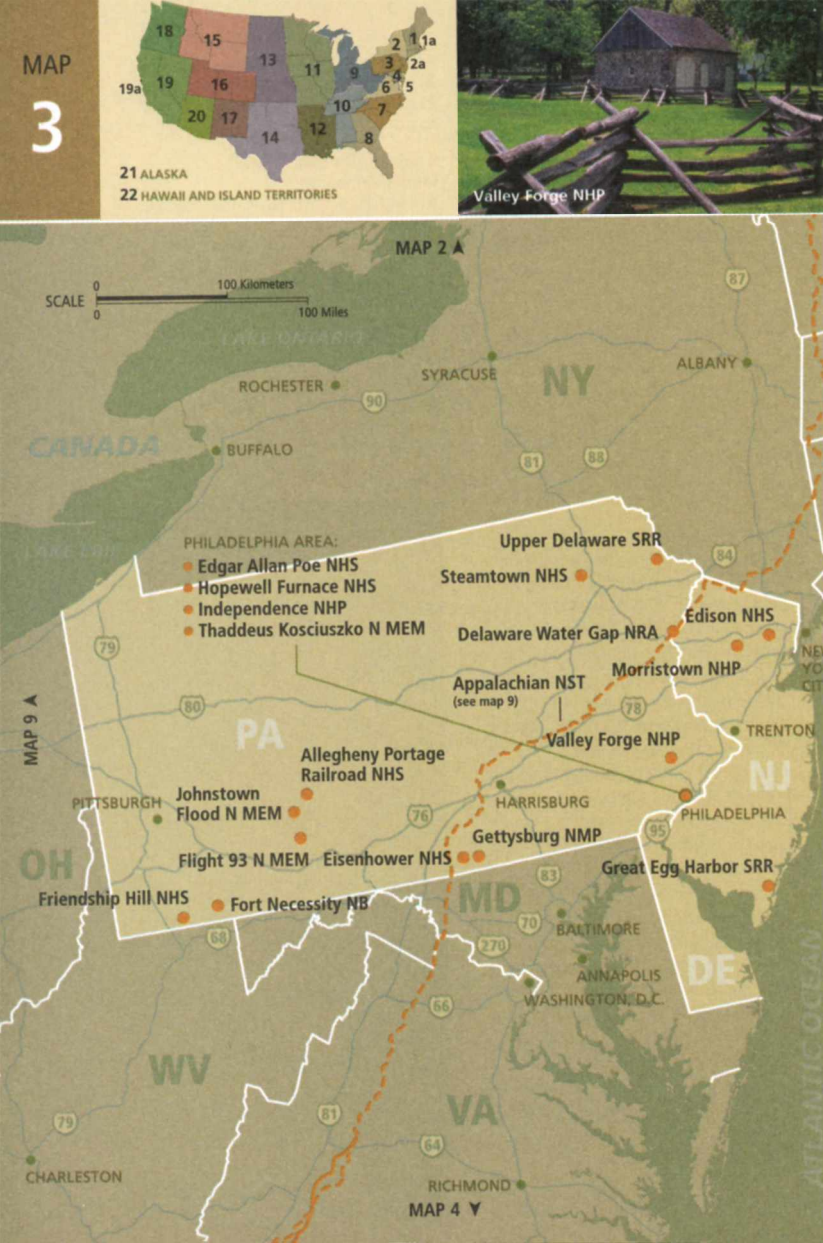

What will you see? Consider this for a well-rounded trip: start by visiting the **Statue of Liberty National Monument** and **Ellis Island**, proceed to the **General Grant National Monument** to learn about this larger-than-life American figure, and then take in some bird watching at **Gateway National Recreation Area**. The following day can begin with a tour of **Saint Paul's Church National Historic Site**, an 18th-century church that is one of New York's oldest parishes and was used as a hospital following the Revolutionary War battle at Pell's Point in 1776. After lunch, be sure to visit the home of founding father Alexander Hamilton, preserved at **Hamilton Grange National Memorial**. Often recalled for his fatal wounding in a duel with political rival Aaron Burr, Hamilton's life was a long list of remarkable achievements, including a major role in creating the U.S. Constitution.

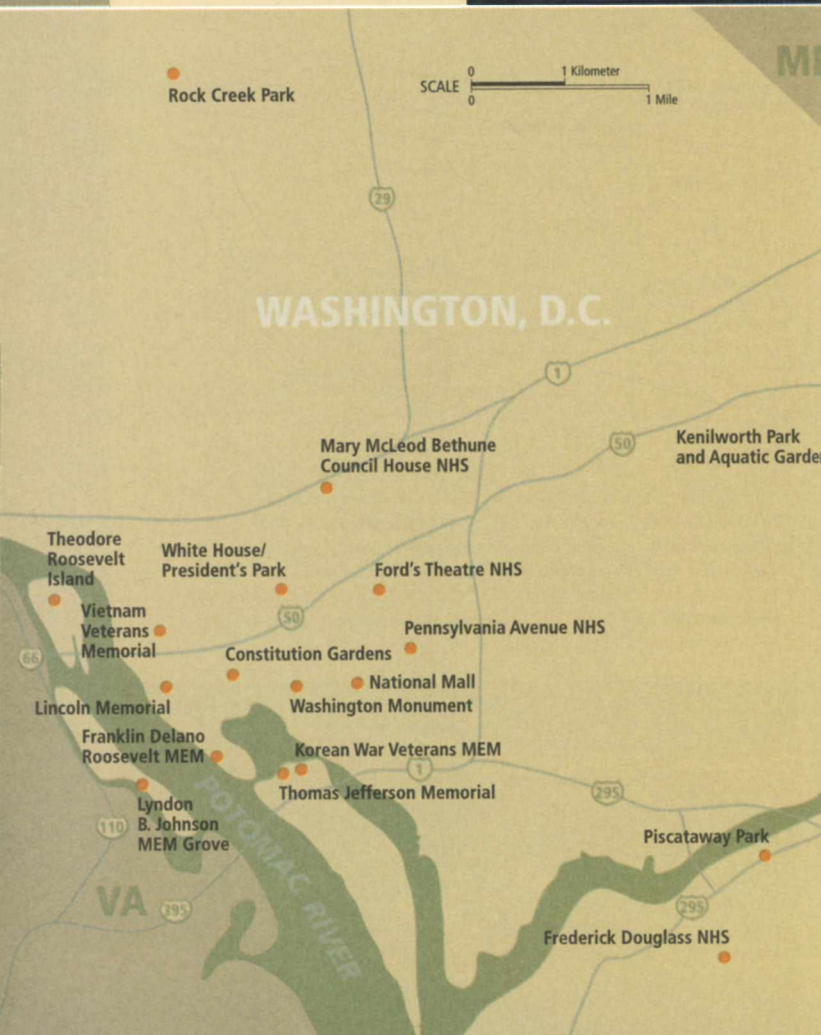

What will you see? For a small state, Maryland offers a rich variety of Park experiences. Civil War buffs can go from **Monocacy National Battlefield** to the infamous Burnside Bridge and Bloody Lane of **Antietam**. A short drive from there is the lush forest of **Catoctin Mountain Park** (and Presidential retreat Camp David). For biking, hiking, and just plain strolling, the **Chesapeake and Ohio Canal National Historical Park** offers more than 180 scenic miles along the Potomac River.

What will you see? Regardless of the season, **Shenandoah National Park** in Virginia's Blue Ridge Mountains is a feast for the eyes. Its lush forests, sparkling streams, and myriad vistas beckon you to explore its trails or traverse by car the famous Skyline Drive—105 twisting and turning miles in all! Energetic hikers can rejoice in a successful climb of Old Rag Mountain and the sweeping views it offers for miles in every direction. At day's end you can choose to pitch a tent or kick back at the Skyland Resort or Big Meadows Lodge; but be sure to plan ahead as Shenandoah is a popular destination year-round. If your next stop is the nation's Capital, consider catching a play, concert, or symphony in the open-air performing arts pavilion of **Wolf Trap National Park for the Performing Arts**.

What will you see? North Carolina's varied landscape includes **Cape Hatteras National Seashore**, a 70-mile reach of barrier islands. Once called the "Graveyard of the Atlantic" for its treacherous currents, shoals, and storms, it is now known for some of the best fishing (and surfing!) on the east coast as well as stretches where you can feel sun, sand, and blissful solitude. In the western tip of the state you should make time to wander the **Carl Sandburg Home National Historic Site**, the former residence and grounds of the nationally renowned poet and biographer. Already famous before locating here in 1945, Sandburg came to North Carolina seeking a peaceful sanctuary for his writing—and pasture land for Mrs. Sandburg to raise her champion dairy goats. During his 22 years here Sandburg published more than one-third of his works. Just a short jaunt to the north and west is the **Blue Ridge Parkway**, a 469-mile recreational motor road that connects **Shenandoah** and **Great Smoky Mountains National Parks**, with eye-catching scenery throughout.

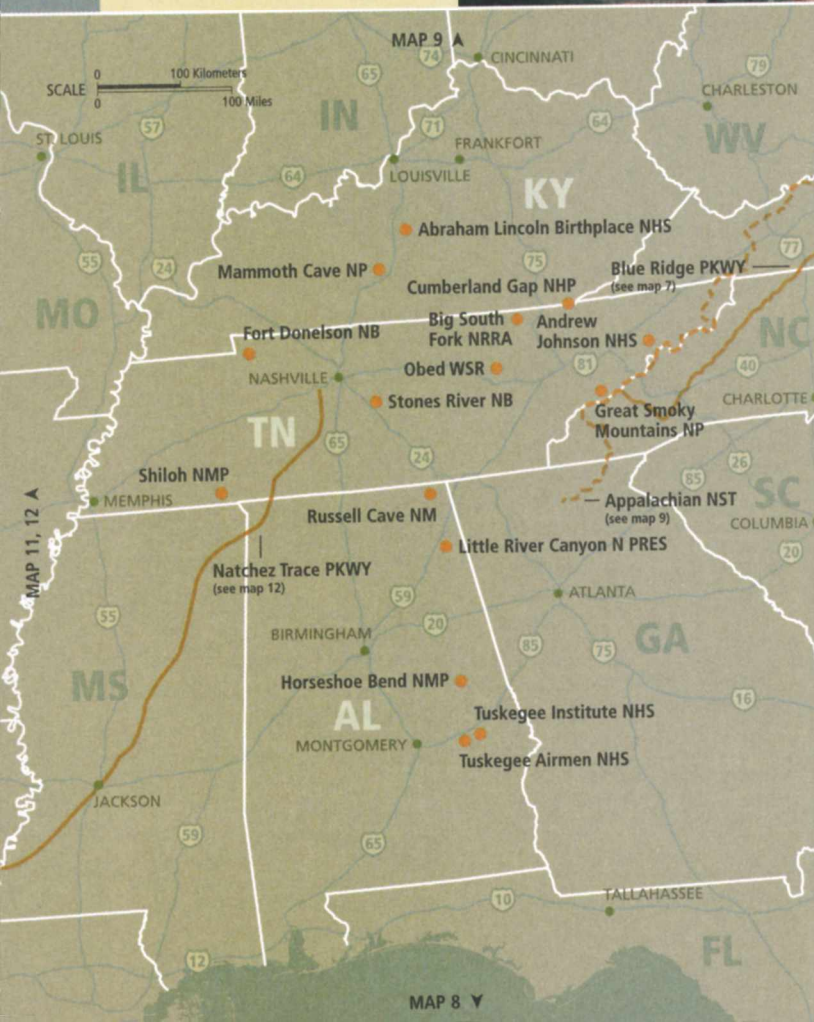

What will you see? Above or below ground, **Mammoth Cave National Park** has plenty of bragging rights. For starters, it is the longest recorded cave system in the world with more than 336 miles explored and mapped. Back on the surface you can wander the Park's scenic river valleys and seek out the Big Woods—one of the few remaining stands of old-growth forest in Kentucky. Before heading home take a short trip north and spend some time at **Abraham Lincoln Birthplace National Historic Site**, where in 1809 the future 16th President of the United States was born in a one-room log cabin.

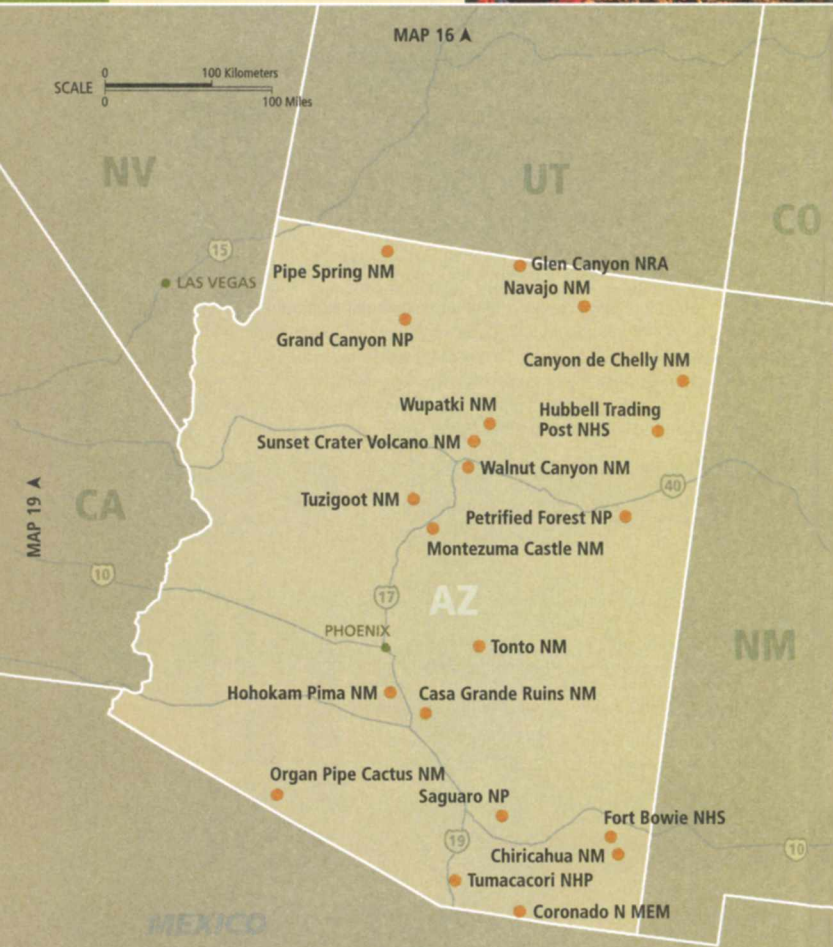

Notable National Park Happenings in 2003

Bicentennial of the Lewis and Clark Expedition

In 1803 President Thomas Jefferson won approval from Congress for a remarkable endeavor, what we now know as the Lewis and Clark Expedition. The Corps of Discovery, led by Captain Meriwether Lewis and Captain William Clark, began its journey into unknown territory and history in the spring of 1804. Along with a small group of recruits that included enlisted soldiers and woodsmen, Lewis and Clark started in Illinois, reaching the Pacific Ocean in 1805 and returning in 1806. Their trek of nearly 3,700 miles passed through portions of Missouri, Kansas, Iowa, Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington.

The Bicentennial celebration of the epic journey of Lewis and Clark across the continent will take place during the years 2003–2006. Educational initiatives are being planned by the National Park Service and other Federal agencies to commemorate this significant chapter in American history. **Be sure to visit the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail site at www.nps.gov for forthcoming details.**

First Flight Centennial

Orville and Wilbur Wright were inspired to fly and 2003 marks the 100th Anniversary of their innovative efforts to achieve the first successful sustained powered flights in a heavier-than-air machine. Wright Brothers National Memorial in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina will be the site of the First Flight Centennial Celebration and education exhibit.

Additionally, Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park in the Dayton, Ohio hometown of the Wright Brothers will be dedicating new interpretive facilities and hosting various Centennial of Flight events in 2003. **Please see the websites for both Parks at www.nps.gov for further information.**

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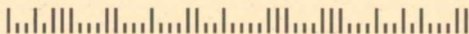
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
