# Some Things to Remember When Visiting Your Parks

Be sure to bring warm clothes. Evenings in the mountains, even in the summer, can be quite cool. Sturdy walking shoes are a must!

When driving in to the Parks from November through May CARRY TIRE CHAINS. Your cooling system should be protected to 10° below zero.

During the winter, Giant Forest is accessible via California 198. Grant Grove is accessible via California 180. "The

is accessible via California 180. "The General's Highway" connecting Grant Grove to Giant Forest is open during the winter. May be closed due to snow. Call (209) 565-3341 for road information.

Pets are not allowed in bath accommodations, and must be under physical control at all times. Pets are not permitted on Park trails.

Food must be stored at all times, assisting the National Park Service in their efforts to maintain Park animals in their natural environment. Black bears eat anything you eat —carelessness with food leads to the death of the bear.

Guest staying in the rustic cabins may wish to bring a hatchet for cutting kindling and sleeping bags as the nights are cool. You are reminded that all food must be stored in your cabins.

Cooking is permitted in the rustic housekeeping cabins ONLY.
