DON'T GET LOST

KNOW where your children are-

ALL-THE-TIME

Children easily become lost in wildlands.

Never let children wander from camp or car alone.

ALWAYS tell someone where you are going AND when you plan to return.

DO your hiking on signed trails only — don't stray off the trails. Travel with a companion, not alone.

HAVE each family member carry a whistle and bright clothing.



BLOW WHISTLE THREE TIMES REPEATEDLY TO GET HELP.

If you plan longer hikes, get maps and a compass and learn to use them.

If you become lost, stay in one spot:

You will be easier to find

You may remember a landmark while resting You will conserve your energy and mental powers

IF YOU TRAVEL BY CAR

Do your sightseeing from a turnout.

Keep your eyes on the road while driving.

Watch where you put your hands and feet.

Don't surprise or disturb them and you'll be O.K.
