STATUE OF LIBERTY NATIONAL MONUMENT AND ELLIS ISLAND

NEW YORK, NEW YORK

One of the most famous symbols of American freedom and opportunity is the Statue of Liberty. Located in New York Harbor, the Statue has been greeting hopeful immigrants and inspiring visitors from all over the world since 1886. There are 354 steps leading to the Statue's crown. The pedestal can be reached by an elevator for those visitors choosing not to climb to the crown.

As the nation's principal immigration receiving station, (1892-1954), over 12 million people have entered the U.S. through Ellis Island. The Ellis Island Immigrations Museum features exhibits, tours, theater presentations, a book/gift shop, cafeteria, and the "American Immigrant Wall of Honor."
