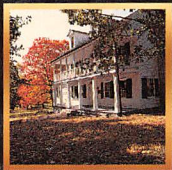

# ULYSSES S. GRANT NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

In 1872, President Ulysses S. Grant established the country's first National Park. Grant could not have imagined that 117 years later, President George Bush would sign legislation authorizing his home as Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site.

The center piece of the park is the family's two-story home named White Haven. Other historic structures on the grounds include an ice house, chicken house, stone building and barn, which houses the visitor center.

The grounds feature several hundred trees of more than 50 species and is a haven for wildlife such as raccoon, woodchuck, rabbit, squirrel, red fox, and a variety of birds.
