Fort Larned was established in 1859 to protect traffic along the Santa Fe Trail from Indian raids. With nine restored buildings, it survives as one of the best examples of Indian Wars period forts. Most of the buildings including: barracks, commissary, officers' quarters and more, are furnished to their original appearance.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

When available, living historians staff the infantry barracks, post blacksmith shop, hospital, blockhouse, commissary and officers' quarters.
