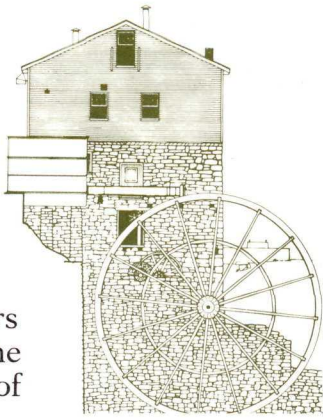


such as making snow shovels from old 55 gallon oil drums. The ideas in each issue are as varied and ingenious as the readers themselves. Each 8



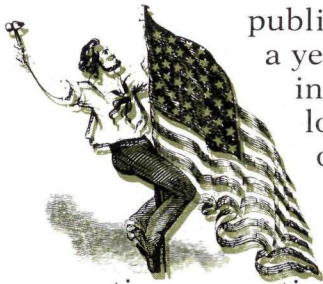

Trends aims to provide balanced information in depth—both theoretical discussions and practical information based on experience that will familiarize the uninitiated as well as those directly involved in the field.

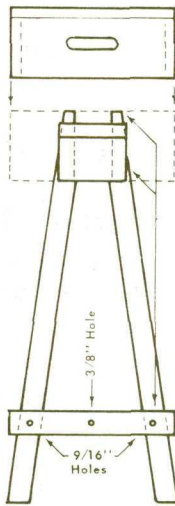

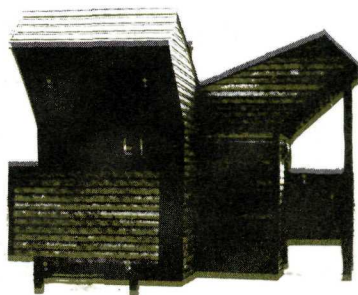

"Design" in Planning



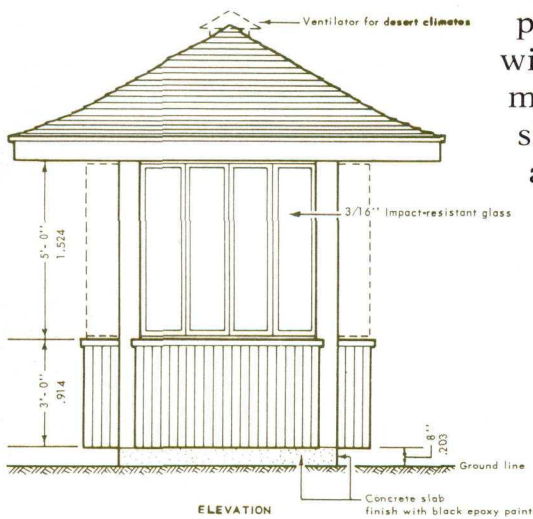
Design is a 16-page quarterly treasure trove containing more than 1,000 detailed plans for park and recreation structures. A recent issue included plans for a concrete picnic shelter, a bait house, multiple camp sites and a visitors center.



In *Design*, the goal is to present plans for practical structures—how to build shelters for campsites, concession stands and every conceivable variety of comfort station. *Design* also provides sketches, elevations and sometimes photographs, of imaginative buildings, in



the hope that they will provide administrators with ammunition to demand better quality designs for public recreation areas.
