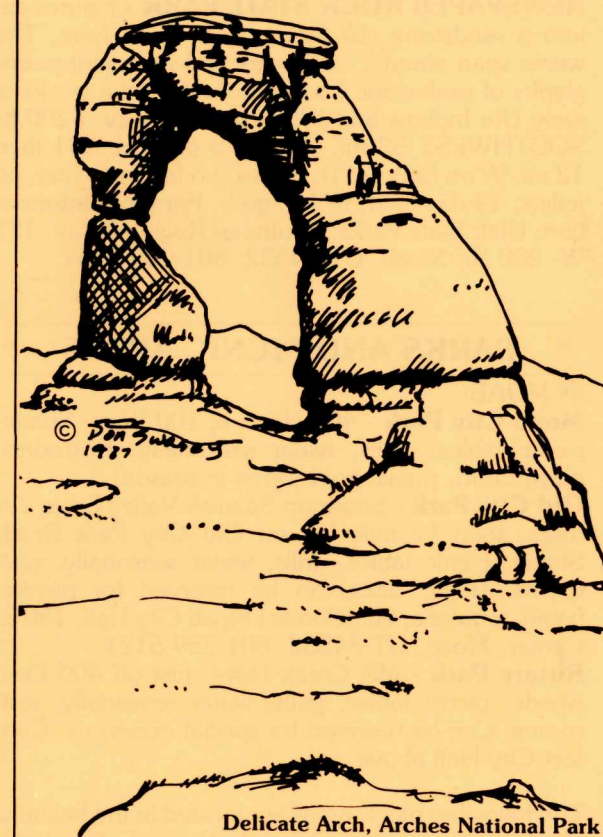

STATE PARKS

Utah State Parks Fun Tag and Senior Pass Accepted

DEAD HORSE POINT STATE PARK - Named for a band of wild horses stranded on the point during a cowboy roundup. An almost isolated island mesa with an overlook 2,000 feet down sheer canyon walls to the Colorado River. Good views into the canyonlands country. Elev. 5900 ft. NORTHWEST, 34 mi. (11 mi. N on U.S. 191 then 23 mi. W on State 313). Paved access road. 21 sites with electricity. \$6 fee includes \$3 entrance fee. Water available, restrooms, RV dump, leashed pets, tables, grills, visitor center. Campground programs during season. For more information: Dead Horse State Park; P.O. NEWSPAPER ROCK STATE PARK - Figures cut into a sandstone cliff face may be seen here. The works span about 1,000 years and represent petroglyphs of prehistoric (Anasazi) through the works of early Ute Indians and White settlers. Elev. 5200 ft. SOUTHWEST 52 mi. (40 mi. S on U.S. 191 then 12 mi. W on State 211). 8 sites, no fee, no water, pit toilets, 14 day limit, tables, grills. PARKS AND PICNIC AREAS

IN MOAB:

Moab City Park - 400 North & 100 West. Shade, picnic tables, grills, water seasonally, restrooms, playground, public pool (open in season).

Old City Park - South on Spanish Valley Drive 2¼ miles, then ½ mile left on Old City Park Road. Shade, picnic tables, grills, water seasonally, restrooms, stage. Sites can be reserved for picnics, family reunions, etc. Contact Moab City Hall, 150 E. Center, Moab, UT 84532; 801-259-5121.

Rotary Park - Mill Creek Drive, just off 400 East. Shade, picnic tables, grills, water seasonally, restrooms. Can be reserved for special occasions. Contact City Hall above.

The following picnic areas are located in the beautiful scenic canyon of the Colorado River. Swimming is not recommended due to the swift current and undertows.

Lion's Park - Elev. 4000 ft. North of Moab 3 miles, at junction of Highways 191 and 128. Shade, picnic tables, grills, water seasonally, restrooms. No overnight camping allowed.

JC Park - Elev. 4000 ft. Northwest 6 mi. (3.5 mi N

on US 191 then 2.5 mi W on State 279). Shade, water seasonally, tables. Hiking trail.

Big Bend (Moose Park) - Elev. 4100 ft. Northeast 10 mi on the Colorado River (2 mi N on US 191 then 8 mi NE on State 128). Shade, picnic tables, grills, pit toilets, no water, fishing (Utah State Fishing License required).

Fisher Towers - Elev. 4500 ft. Northeast 26 mi on Colorado River (N on US 191 2 mi then NE 24 mi on State 128. Tables, grills, pit toilets, no water, hiking trail.

NATIONAL PARKS

ARCHES NATIONAL PARK — World's greatest concentration of natural stone arches are found here. Several hiking trails and viewpoints. Guided walks and campfire programs during the summer. Entrance fee of \$3 collected, which is good for 7 days. \$1 fee per person on foot, bike or on commercial tour; Golden Eagle and Golden Age Passes accepted. Permits are required for backcountry camping. For more information or group site reservations: Arches National Park; 125 W. 200 S.; Moab, UT 84532; 801-259-8161.

Devil's Garden Campground - Elev. 5355 ft. NORTH 22 mi. (5 mi N. on U.S. 191 then 18 mi. N in Park). 54 sites, some pull-thru, \$5 fee per night, 14 day limit. Restrooms and pit toilets, grills, no hookups, no dump. Open year round, water available May thru October. 1 large group site/1 small group site. \$20 minimum or \$2 per person if there are more than 10 people, tents only, 7 day limit.

CANYONLANDS NATIONAL PARK — This park is divided into three districts, with two accessible from Moab. Entrance fee of \$3 collected which is good 7 days. \$1 per person on foot, bike or commercial tour. Guided walks and campfire programs during the summer. There are several primitive campgrounds located on the White Rim Trail, Island-In-The-Sky District, and in the Needles District, all accessible by 4WD only. A permit is required for overnight backcountry use in all districts of the Park. For more information: Canyonlands National Park; 125 W. 200 S.; Moab, UT 84532; 801-259-7164.

Island-In-The-Sky District - Mesa-top views across and into the many canyons which give Canyonlands its name. Viewpoints, hiking, 4-wheeling. **Willow Flat Campground** - Elev. 6987 ft. NORTH 42 mi. (11 mi. N on U.S. 191 then 31 mi. W. 12 sites, no fee, no water, 14 day limit, pit toilets, tables, grills.

Needles District - Named for the colorful rock formations which make up this region. Excellent hiking, 4-wheeling, campfire programs during summer.

Squaw Flats Campground - Elev. 5100 ft. SOUTHWEST 75 mi. (40 miles S on U.S. 191 then 35 mi. W on State 211). 26 sites, no fee. Pit toilets, water available at central point 2 miles from campground. 3 group sites, no fee. 14 day limit.

Needles Outpost - (Private at entrance to Needles District, Canyonlands National Park) Elev. 4950 ft. Camping, 20 partial hook-ups, store, snack bar, ice, gas, propane, restrooms, showers, firewood, jeep tours and scenic flights. U.S. FOREST SERVICE

The campgrounds listed below are nestled in the cool forests of the Manti-LaSal National Forest offering excellent fishing (licensed only) and hiking. For further information on campgrounds and for group reservations: U.S. Forest Service; 125 W. 200 S.; Moab, UT 84532; 801-259-7155.

Warner Lake Campground/Picnic Area -Elev. 9200 ft. SOUTHEAST 30 mi. (S 9 mi. on U.S. 191 then E 16 mi. on LaSal Mountain Loop Road to campground turnoff then 5 mi. E). 20 sites, \$4 fee, 16 day limit, water seasonally, vault toilets, tables, grills, licensed fishing only. Closed in winter.

Lake Oowah Campground - Elev. 8800 ft. SOUTHEAST 25½ mi. (9 mi. S on U.S. 191 then E 13½ mi. on LaSal Mountain Loop Road to Oowah turnoff, then 3 mi. E). 15 sites, no fee, no water, 16 day limit, vault toilets, tables, grills, licensed fishing only.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

Grand Resource Area

The following campgrounds are located on the high mesas of the Canyon Rims Recreation Area, which is popular for its spectacular views of the canyon country from Needles Overlook and Anticline Overlook. Windwhistle - Elev. 6000 ft. SOUTHWEST 37 mi. (S 32 mi. on U.S. 191 then W 5 mi.). 25 sites, \$3 fee, 14 day limit, water April-October, pit toilets, grills.

Hatch Point - Elev. 6000 ft. S 32 mi. on U.S. 191 then W & N 25 mi. 10 sites, pit toilets, tables, grills, water April-October.
