Please don't attempt to catch reptiles in the park. Lizard tails come off easily and a tail-less lizard is put under stress when it can no longer depend on the food it normally stores as fat in its tail.

Reptiles bite when forced to defend themselves.

Remember, collection and/or harassment of park animals is prohibited.

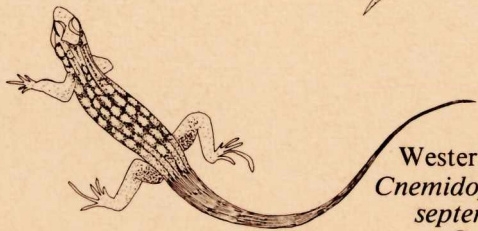

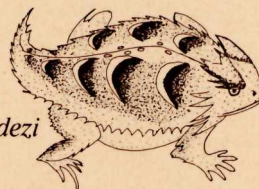

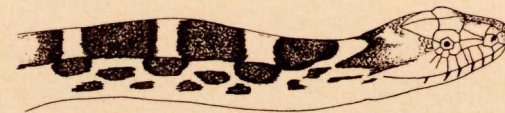

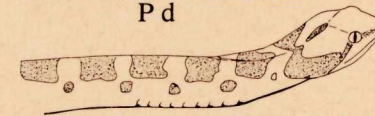
