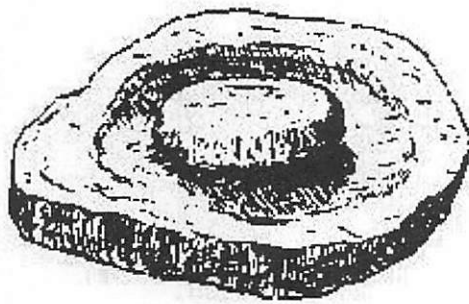
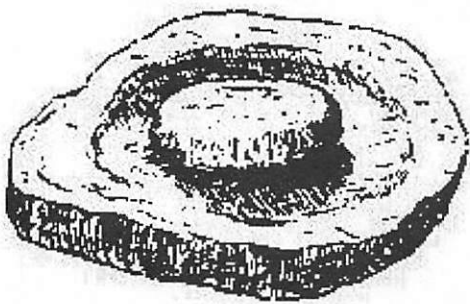
Long ago, people lived here in these stone buildings. Today we call them the Ancestral Pueblo people.



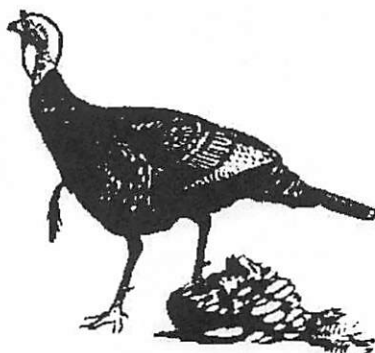
The people here grew corn, beans, and squash - food that you might eat in your home! Circle the corn.



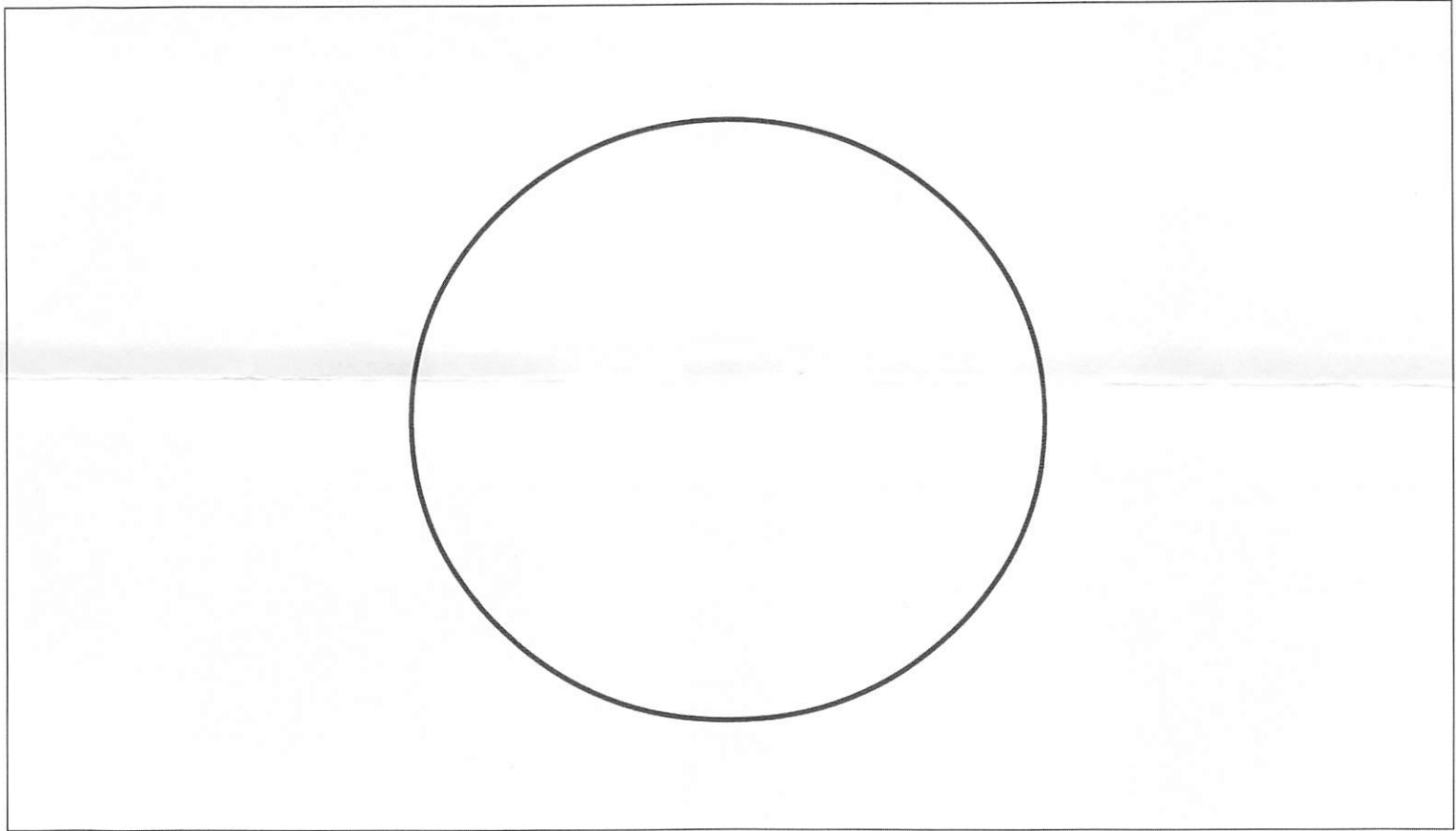
They used two stones, called a mano and metate, to grind corn into flour. Circle each mano and metate.



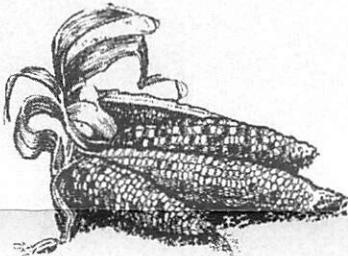
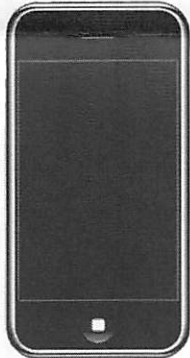
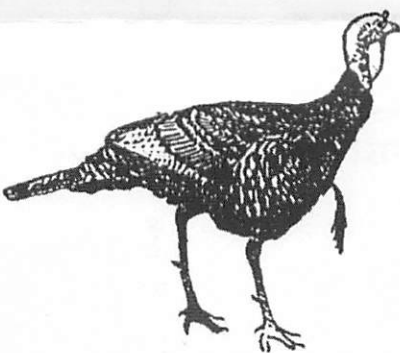
The people here also made clay pots. Sometimes they stored corn in the pots. Circle each clay pot.
