National Monument



WELCOME

The Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument is an ecological wonder in southwestern Oregon, east of Ashland. This region lies at the convergence of the Cascade Range, the Siskiyou Mountains, and Klamath Mountains. Pilot Rock, a volcanic plug, is the most recognized feature.

This complex geology dating back 425 million years provides the foundation for a unique landscape and diverse habitats. More than 3,500 species of plants and animals live here to make this one of the five most biodiverse temperate forests in the world.

Established in 2000, the monument is part of America's National Conservation Lands System monitored and managed by the Bureau of Land Management.

Plan Your Own Visit in the Monument

HIKE

The Pacific Coast Trail has 13 access points for hiking. Find awe-inspiring vistas, geological formations, and plant and animal communities along the trail.

DRIVE

Highway 66 follows the historic Applegate Trail into western Oregon. Stop at interpretive markers for insights into the long wagon journey west.

STAY

Hyatt Lake offers four BLM campgrounds as well as plenty of recreation activities. Rustic lodging and dining can also be found.
