- From Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day, Cape Hatteras National Seashore lifeguards are on duty from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at <u>five lifeguard beaches</u>.
- Cape Hatteras National Seashore provides the following tips to help visitors stay safe this year:
 - Swim at lifeguard beaches between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.
 - Text OBXBeachConditions to 77295 to sign up for beach-related weather and ocean condition alerts.
 - Avoid digging <u>deep holes in the beach</u> due to the danger they present to beachgoers, emergency response staff and wildlife.
 - Stay indoors during a thunder or lightning storm. If you can hear thunder, you are close enough to be struck by lightning.
