The solid white exterior coloration of the Ocracoke Lighthouse serves as its identifying mark to mariners by day. The original whitewash "recipe" called for blending lime, salt, spanish whiting, rice, glue, and boiling water. The mixture was applied while still hot.


Though the lighthouse is not open for climbing, the site can be visited daily.
