Seashore Updates

- Lifeguard services will be added at the Frisco Beach Access starting this Memorial Day weekend. Lifeguards will be on duty daily from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm through Labor Day. [Press Release]
- On the morning of Monday, May 6, a protection buffer was put in place in the Cape Point area to protect nesting colonial waterbirds (least terns). There are also three piping plover nests and two American oystercatcher nests near Cape Point.
 - ORVs and pedestrians can currently travel 0.64 miles south of ORV Ramp 44.
 - There are over 26 out of 29 miles open for ORV use across the Seashore.
 - Staff will continue to monitor the Cape Point area and will remove the protection buffer as soon as possible.
