

Seashore Updates

- On August 14 and August 28, explore the historic U.S. Weather Bureau Station in Hatteras with park rangers and learn about the vital role this station played in predicting the weather and safeguarding the residents of the Outer Banks in the early 1900s. Participants will have the chance to practice taking weather readings following the program. [Press Release]
- Cape Hatteras National Seashore will celebrate International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend on August 17 and August 18. Park staff and members of the Outer Banks Repeater Association will have HAM Radios set up at Bodie Island and Cape Hatteras Lighthouses to communicate over the air-waves with other participating lighthouses and lightships from around the world. - As of August 8 at 9 a.m., staff have found 443 sea turtle nests across the Seashore. The previous record for a single season was 325 nests. According to SeaTurtle.org, 2,244 sea turtle nests have been found in North Carolina.
- On August 4, a pedestrian corridor was installed along the shoreline south of Ramp 72 on Ocracoke Island. The corridor allows pedestrians to travel all the way to Ocracoke Inlet. Additional ORV access will be provided when possible.
