

# **Seashore Updates**

 The National Park Service was created on August 25, 1916, when President Woodrow Wilson signed the National Park Service Act. Admission fees will be waived at Wright Brothers National Memorial this Sunday.

 On August 19, a small fixed-wing, single-engine plane crash-landed approximately 30 yards from the runway at Cape Hatteras National Seashore's Ocracoke Island Airport. The pilot and passenger walked away from the crash

with only minor injuries.

 As of August 22 at 8 a.m., staff have found 463 sea turtle nests across the Seashore. The previous record for a single season was 325 nests.

Leaving large holes in the beach creates hazardous conditions for seashore visitors, emergency response personnel, and wildlife. Beachgoers are encouraged to be considerate of others by leaving no trace of visits.
