

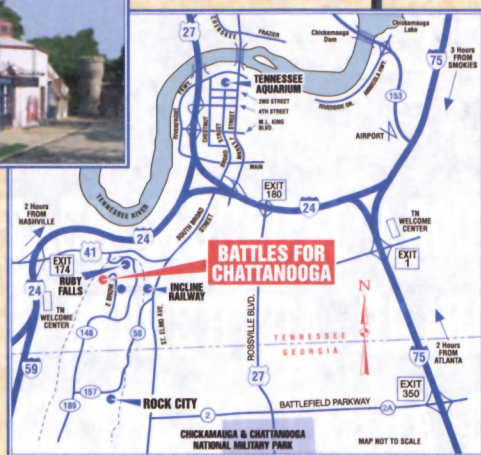

CSA 18,454 (2,312 killed, 14,674 wounded, 1,468 missing)

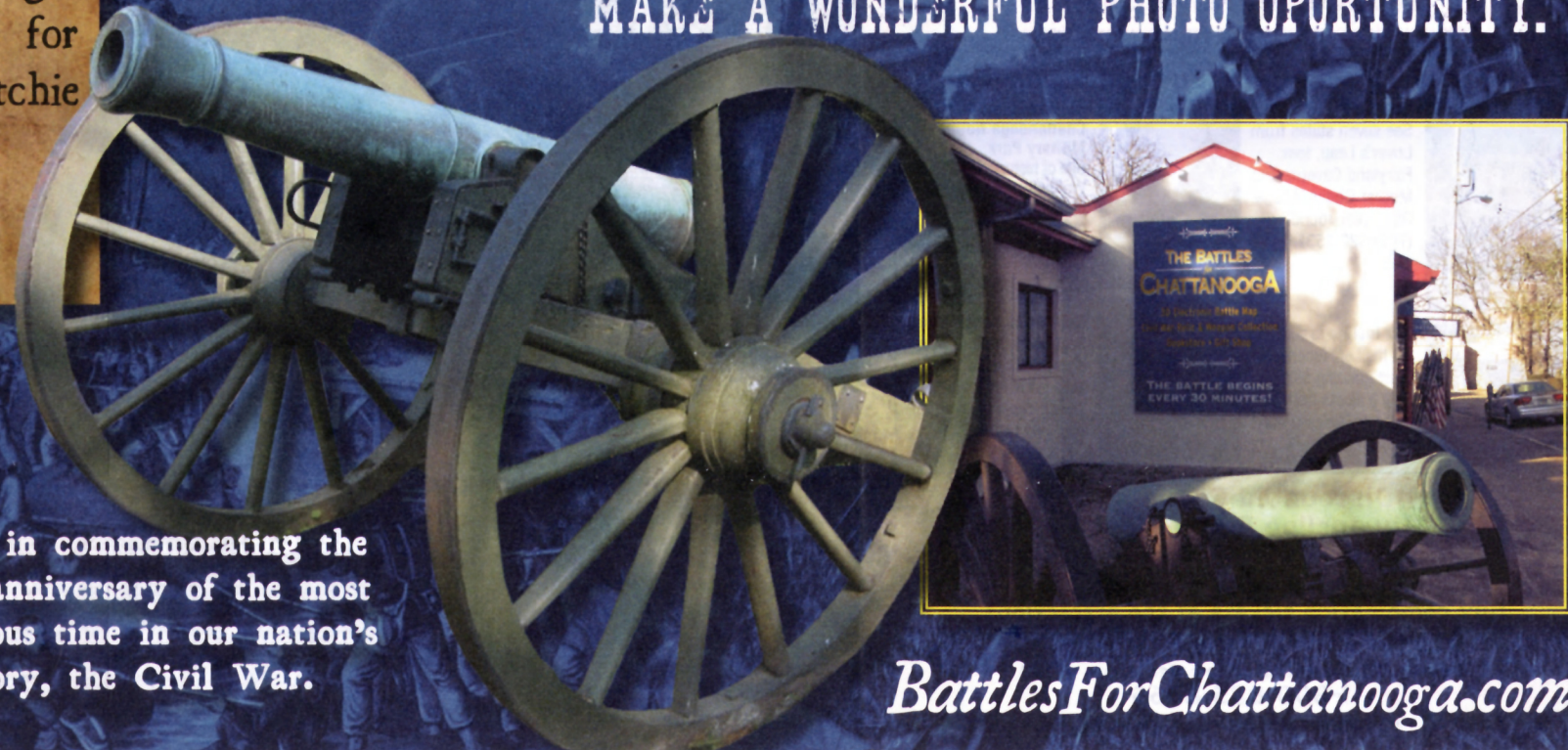
Chattanooga:

US 5,824 (753 killed, 4,722 wounded, 349 missing)
CSA 6,667 (361 killed, 2,160 wounded, 4,146 missing)
